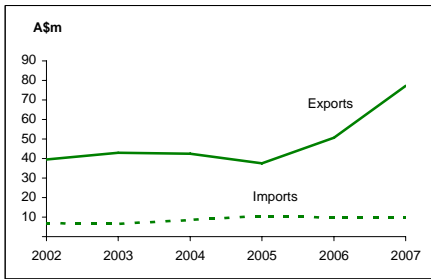

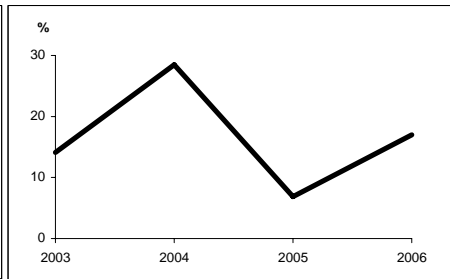

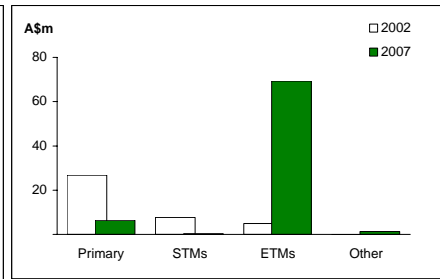
Australia's merchandise trade with Macau
