Universal Periodic Review of Senegal

Statement by Australia

Australia welcomes positive measures taken by Senegal in adopting a national strategy on equality and non-discrimination of women. However, we note that access to sexual and reproductive health services remains limited in Senegal. Australia recommends Senegal support the full realisation of sexual and reproductive rights and access to relevant health services for all.

Australia is concerned by reports of child exploitation and trafficking through some educational institutions in Senegal. Australia recommends Senegal prioritise the full and effective implementation of the Convention of the Rights of the Child.

We note that Senegal's national human rights institution, the Comité Sénégalais, lacks the necessary resources to enable it to function independently. Australia recommends that Senegal enact legislation to bring the Comité Sénégalais into full compliance with the Paris Principles.

Australia is deeply concerned that legislation criminalising homosexuality remains in force in Senegal. Australia recommends that Senegal decriminalise same-sex relationships between consenting adults and strengthen efforts to address inequality, violence and discrimination based on sexual orientation and gender identity.
