## A. INITIATING AUSTRALIAN LETTER TO NEW ZEALAND

My dear High Commissioner

I refer to the Australia New Zealand Closer Economic Relations - Trade Agreement signed today at Canberra.

I wish to bring to your attention that Australian legislation provides in general terms that goods the produce or manufacture of New Zealand are not subject to sales tax if they are goods of the same class or kind as goods upon the sale value of which, if produced or manufactured in Australia, sales tax is not payable. However, for technical reasons, certain fruit juices and fruit juice products of New Zealand origin which would be required to be exempt under the Agreement would not be exempt under the terms of existing Australian legislation.

In order to meet this difficulty, and to permit the Agreement to come into force without further delay, I propose that pending the passage of legislation amending the Australian legislation to which I have referred, both Governments regard Article 7 of the Agreement as being suspended in its application to fruit juice and fruit juice products except those covered by exemptions under existing Australian legislation and equivalent goods in New Zealand.

I wish to propose that if the foregoing is acceptable to the Government of New Zealand this letter and your confirmatory reply shall together constitute an Agreement between our two Governments which shall enter into force on today's date.
