Tracer Survey Outcomes Summary: Bangladesh

This country report details the responses of alumni from **Bangladesh** to the Australia Awards Global Tracer Facility **Tracer Survey** carried out in 2018-19. The Tracer Survey was conducted between November 2018 and February 2019 and targeted **alumni who completed their award between 2011 and 2016**.

Alumni were asked a range of questions via an online survey, focussed on exploring the long-term outcomes of the Australia Awards. In total 3,768 alumni in this cohort from more than 123 different countries participated in the survey. A 26 per cent response rate of the target cohort was achieved globally. This report focuses on the response data of alumni from Bangladesh.

For Bangladesh, there were 586 alumni included in the target population. Responses were received from 134, a **response rate of 23 per cent**. Among these respondents, 105 were scholarship alumni and 29 were fellowship alumni.

The survey data provide a valuable quantitative insight into alumni use of knowledge and skills, development of networks and contribution to cooperation with Australia. The responses also offer rich examples from alumni of the types of contributions they are making, the way in which they are using their award, and the things that help and hinder them in reaching their potential.

The data detailed here are reported based on the four long-term outcomes of the Australia Awards as articulated in the *Australia Awards Global Strategy: Investing in the next generation of global leaders for development 2016-2018* and the Australia Awards Global Monitoring and Evaluation Framework. In terms of responding to the **long-term outcomes** of the Australia Awards, the following summary offers findings based on the responses of alumni from Bangladesh. Further outcomes are included in the infographic following this summary.

Outcome 1: Alumni are using their skills, knowledge and networks to contribute to sustainable development.

- Most alumni from Bangladesh (98 per cent) indicated they have passed on their skills and knowledge to others in their country on return from their award.
- 97 per cent of alumni indicated they had introduced improved practices and innovations in their work on return from their award.

Outcome 2: Alumni are contributing to cooperation between Australia and partner countries.

- 57 per cent of alumni from Bangladesh have maintained frequent contact with fellow alumni, while 51 per cent have frequent contact with friends in Australia and 43 per cent with Australian students/alumni.
- In terms of frequent contact with Australian organisations, 33 per cent of alumni have frequent contact with Australian institutions, 20 per cent of alumni have frequent contact with Australian businesses and 15 per cent with Australian Embassies, High Commissions or Consulates.

Outcome 3: Effective, mutually advantageous partnerships between institutions and businesses in Australia and partner countries.

- 44 per cent of alumni from Bangladesh indicated having had a professional link with an Australian organisation at some time following award.
- These links were with Australian universities, the government sector, the private sector, non-government organisations and the Australian High Commission or Consulate.

Outcome 4: Alumni view Australia, Australians and Australian expertise positively.

- Most alumni from Bangladesh (97 per cent) indicated their experience in Australia positively influenced their perception of Australia.
- Most alumni (98 per cent) have provided advice to people in Bangladesh about pursuing opportunities in Australia.

The Tracer Survey represented the views of a range of alumni from Bangladesh. Of those who responded, **49 per cent were women and 95 per cent came from an urban location**. The largest age group represented were alumni 30 to 39 years. Among all alumni, 85 per cent were employed full-time. Of those alumni employed, **66 per cent** indicated that they hold a **formal leadership role**.

The data tables correspond to each of the Australia Awards long-term outcomes and include benchmark data from the entire survey response population.




Tracer Survey 2018–2019 Bangladesh Overview



alumni voices

I am currently working on a collaborative project funded and lead by CSIRO, Australia. In this project, I have the opportunity to use my knowledge of Integrated Water Management obtained from my Masters in Australia to suggest management options that can balance food production and sustainability of groundwater status under future climate change scenarios.

I have introduced a system to econometrically project the inflows and outflows of foreign currency which was not practiced before I joined my current department. I should admit that I have learned the skills during my Masters degree in Australia.

I have successfully established a network between the Police Staff College Bangladesh (PSC) and Macquarie University Australia (MQ) which led obtaining training opportunities for 15 Bangladesh police officials hosted by MQ under the Australia Awards Fellowship Round 16. PSC and MQ now collaborate through signing a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on a range of academic arenas. Networks were also built with the Australian High Commission Bangladesh through this MoU.
