# Tracer Survey Outcomes Summary: Cameroon

This country report details the responses of alumni from **Cameroon** to the Australia Awards Global Tracer Facility **Tracer Survey** carried out in 2018-19. The Tracer Survey was conducted between November 2018 and February 2019 and targeted **alumni who completed their award between 2011 and 2016**.

Alumni were asked a range of questions via an online survey, focussed on exploring the long-term outcomes of the Australia Awards. In total 3,768 alumni in this cohort from more than 123 different countries participated in the survey. A 26 per cent response rate of the target cohort was achieved globally. This report focuses on the response data of alumni from Cameroon.

For Cameroon, there were 43 alumni included in the target population. Responses were received from 10, a **response rate of 23 per cent**. Among these respondents, seven were scholarship alumni and three were fellowship alumni.

The survey data provide a valuable quantitative insight into alumni use of knowledge and skills, development of networks and contribution to cooperation with Australia. The responses also offer rich examples from alumni of the types of contributions they are making, the way in which they are using their award, and the things that help and hinder them in reaching their potential.

The data detailed here are reported based on the four long-term outcomes of the Australia Awards as articulated in the *Australia Awards Global Strategy: Investing in the next generation of global leaders for development 2016-2018* and the Australia Awards Global Monitoring and Evaluation Framework. In terms of responding to the **long-term outcomes** of the Australia Awards, the following summary offers findings based on the responses of alumni from Cameroon. Further outcomes are included in the infographic following this summary.

**Outcome 1:** Alumni are using their skills, knowledge and networks to contribute to sustainable development.

- All alumni from Cameroon indicated they have passed on their skills and knowledge to others in their country on return from their award.
- All alumni indicated they had introduced improved practices and innovations in their work on return from their award.

**Outcome 2:** Alumni are contributing to cooperation between Australia and partner countries.

- 90 per cent of alumni from Cameroon have maintained frequent contact with fellow alumni, while 60 per cent have frequent contact with friends in Australia and 60 per cent with Australian students/alumni.
- In terms of frequent contact with Australian organisations, 40 per cent of alumni have frequent contact with Australian institutions, 20 per cent of alumni have frequent contact with Australian businesses and 10 per cent with Australian Embassies, High Commissions or Consulates.

**Outcome 3:** Effective, mutually advantageous partnerships between institutions and businesses in Australia and partner countries.

- 50 per cent of alumni from Cameroon indicated having had a professional link with an Australian organisation at some time following award.
- These links were with Australian universities and the government sector.

**Outcome 4:** Alumni view Australia, Australians and Australian expertise positively.

- Most alumni from Cameroon (90 per cent) indicated their experience in Australia positively influenced their perception of Australia.
- All alumni have provided advice to people in Cameroon about pursuing opportunities in Australia.

The Tracer Survey represented the views of a range of alumni from Cameroon. Of those who responded, **40 per cent were women and 80 per cent came from an urban location**. The largest age group represented were alumni 30 to 39 years. Among all alumni, 80 per cent were employed full-time. Of those alumni employed, **89 per cent** indicated that they hold a **formal leadership role**.



Tracer Survey 2018–2019 Cameroon Overview





On my return from Australia, I was recruited as a part time lecturer and I have been teaching fundamentals of nursing for two years now. In addition, my reproductive health care services used to have limited contraception options, on my return, I expanded family planning services to cover all the methods. I taught my junior colleagues on the administration of the different contraception methods to ensure continuity of services in my absence. I became a better nursing educator after completing my award, I have contributed since my return to equip nurses with better skills and knowledge. Upon graduation, they use these skills to serve the Cameroonian society thus contributing to the country's national plan of improved quality of health care.

While in Australia I searched for and contacted Cameroonians who are based in Australia and their respective networks. Upon return I contacted some of them to support some home based projects such as the construction of school buildings for rural communities. My wish is to create a platform where these Australians can travel to Cameroon to share their respective skill sets or maybe deliver online training for health care staff.
