Tracer Survey Outcomes Summary: Sierra Leone

This country report details the responses of alumni from **Sierra Leone** to the Australia Awards Global Tracer Facility **Tracer Survey** carried out in 2018-19. The Tracer Survey was conducted between November 2018 and February 2019 and targeted **alumni who completed their award between 2011 and 2016**.

Alumni were asked a range of questions via an online survey, focussed on exploring the long-term outcomes of the Australia Awards. In total 3,768 alumni in this cohort from more than 123 different countries participated in the survey. A 26 per cent response rate of the target cohort was achieved globally. This report focuses on the response data of alumni from Sierra Leone.

For Sierra Leone, there were 41 alumni included in the target population. Responses were received from eight, a **response rate of 20 per cent**. Among these respondents, eight were scholarship alumni.

The survey data provide a valuable quantitative insight into alumni use of knowledge and skills, development of networks and contribution to cooperation with Australia. The responses also offer rich examples from alumni of the types of contributions they are making, the way in which they are using their award, and the things that help and hinder them in reaching their potential.

The data detailed here are reported based on the four long-term outcomes of the Australia Awards as articulated in the *Australia Awards Global Strategy: Investing in the next generation of global leaders for development 2016-2018* and the Australia Awards Global Monitoring and Evaluation Framework. In terms of responding to the **long-term outcomes** of the Australia Awards, the following summary offers findings based on the responses of alumni from Sierra Leone. Further outcomes are included in the infographic following this summary.

Outcome 1: Alumni are using their skills, knowledge and networks to contribute to sustainable development.

- All alumni from Sierra Leone indicated they have passed on their skills and knowledge to others in their country on return from their award.
- All alumni indicated they had introduced improved practices and innovations in their work on return from their award.

Outcome 2: Alumni are contributing to cooperation between Australia and partner countries.

- 83 per cent of alumni from Sierra Leone have maintained frequent contact with fellow alumni, while 50 per cent have frequent contact with friends in Australia and 33 per cent with Australian students/alumni.
- In terms of frequent contact with Australian organisations, 17 per cent of alumni have frequent contact with Australian Embassies, High Commissions or Consulates.

Outcome 3: Effective, mutually advantageous partnerships between institutions and businesses in Australia and partner countries.

- 33 per cent of alumni from Sierra Leone indicated having had a professional link with an Australian organisation at some time following award
- These links were with Australian universities and the private sector.

Outcome 4: Alumni view Australia, Australians and Australian expertise positively.

- All alumni from Sierra Leone indicated their experience in Australia positively influenced their perception of Australia.
- All alumni have provided advice to people in Sierra Leone about pursuing opportunities in Australia.

The Tracer Survey represented the views of a range of alumni from Sierra Leone. Of those who responded, **38 per cent were women and 88 per cent came from an urban location**. The largest age group represented were alumni 30 to 49 years. All alumni were employed full-time. **All of the alumni respondents indicated that they hold formal leadership roles in their employment.**

The data tables correspond to each of the Australia Awards long-term outcomes and include benchmark data from the entire survey response population.




Tracer Survey 2018–2019 Sierra Leone Overview

alumni voices

I am currently engaged in training front line and immediate level residents for the Field Epidemiology Training Programme in country. This training involves training health personnel as disease detectives.

We have established an alumni group that is in touch with DFAT. We received small grants from DFAT and implemented a project in the health sector by rehabilitating a health centre in a remote community.

I have been able to develop strong ties with the Sierra Leonean communities in some states in Australia including the ACT and NSW. I have successfully designed a nutrition intervention program that takes into account the expressed needs of the specific communities involved without imposing on them the "stipulated" practices as described for such interventions.

I led the response in one of the districts during the 2014/2015 Ebola outbreak in Sierra Leone. Through the training I got I was able to effectively lead a multidisciplinary team of health professionals. My district was the first among the 14 districts in Sierra Leone to control the Ebola outbreak.
