## Key engagement

Costa Rica is Australia's second largest trading partner in Central America. We jointly pursue common interests in multilateral fora, particularly the United Nations (UN).

#### Outlook

Trade and investment opportunities exist in Costa Rica for Australian businesses, including in renewable energy and professional services.

#### Bilateral relations

In 1884, Costa Rica opened a consular office in NSW. Australia and Costa Rica established diplomatic relations in 1974. Costa Rica opened an Embassy in Canberra in 2017.

Australia's Ambassador to Mexico holds non-resident accreditation to Costa Rica and Australia has an Honorary Consul in San José.

## Foreign relations

Australia and Costa Rica are members of the Cairns Group of agricultural exporting countries, World Trade Organisation (WTO) and United Nations (UN).

Costa Rica is a member of the Pacific Alliance, Central American Integration System (SICA), Organization of American States (OAS), Community of Latin American and Caribbean States (CELAC), the Forum for East Asia-Latin America Cooperation (FEALAC), Association of Caribbean States (ACS), Africa, Caribbean and Pacific (ACP) Group of States, and other regional organisations.

Costa Rica acceded to the OECD in 2021.

## High level engagement

In 2020, the Australian Embassy in Mexico hosted a webinar on Australia's biosecurity expertise to combat Fusarium wilt of bananas. The event attracted over 180 participants from 13 different countries, including Costa Rica.

Through the <u>Direct Aid Program (DAP)</u>, the Australian Government supports projects coordinated by civil society, that empower women and girls, and advocate for the rights of indigenous communities, persons with disabilities and LGBTIQI+ communities. DAP funds have also been used to help many of these disadvantaged groups recover from the economic impacts of COVID-19. The Australian Embassy in Mexico has hosted a number of webinars in collaboration with sponsored NGOs to highlight the outcomes of these projects. In 2020-21, funding is being provided to promote non-discrimination in schools.

## Economic diplomacy

The Australian Government assists Australian investors in Costa Rica by providing support and advice on political, economic and regulatory environments.
