

- Offering study, research and professional development in Australia through Australia Awards Indonesia [\$128 million 2022-2030].
- Strengthening the contributions of civil society to gender equality, disability and social inclusion through INKLUSI [\$120 million 2021-2028].
- Supporting partnerships between knowledge organisations to create inclusive and sustainable policies through KONEKSI [\$50 million 2022-2027].
