

### Summary

Post's "50 Bridges" arts and community engagement showcase is now ready for Minister Bishop's launch event on 20 May. Through its scale and edgy content, we aim to make an impact in an environment that is crowded with 50th year celebrations. And by focussing on Singapore "heartlands", we are tuning in to a deeper Singapore dynamic than the elite performances that other embassies are staging. The support of the Australian business community (worth around \$450,000 in sponsorship) and DFAT's seed funding have been crucial to our success. HOM thanks High Commission colleagues, and many others, for what is a major effort.

In a visit that will have a number of highlights, Foreign Minister Bishop will be launching "50 Bridges", Australia's arts and community engagement showcase, during her brief time in Singapore on 20 May. This cable provides background and an update on "50 Bridges".

- 2. 2015 is the 50th year of Singapore's independence and also the 50th anniversary of the opening of bilateral relations between Singapore and a number of governments. It is a crowded year, with Singapore itself launching its new Sports Hub, opening its world class National Gallery, hosting the South East Asian Games, and organising a major celebration around its 9 August anniversary day.
- 3. Playing into this complex and crowded environment, we aimed to organise a showcase that would have an impact. "50 Bridges" seeks to do this in a variety of ways:
- Firstly, with substantial scale. With strong support from the Australian business community, we have a total budget for "50 Bridges" of around \$500,000. This is allowing us to mount a showcase across a large number (around 25) locations concentrated over a fortnight. We have benefitted from the strong sense of national spirit of Australian businesses here, and their own understanding of the 50th anniversary's significance for

Singapore. DFAT's (PCD) \$50,000 in seed funding was crucial in leveraging the wider contributions.

- Second, content that would stand out. We chose to lead with Melbourne street art (one of the three elements of "50 Bridges"), which in the Singapore context is edgy and innovative s.33(a)(iii)

  we won the support of the Singapore ministry responsible for culture for this focus. And while we have needed to build in a number of safeguards (notably restrictions on what artist can and cannot paint), this focus is shaping to give "50 Bridges" media carry, and to highlight Australia's innovative, 'cool' culture.
- Third, playing into Singapore's focus on their "heartlands" locations. s.33(a)(iii) s.33(a)(iii) In this environment, we have deliberately shunned downtown Singapore with its steel and glass towers, and are staging "50 Bridges" substantially in the HDB communities where most Singaporeans live and where many of Singapore's glitzy successes originate.
- Fourthly, with a media strategy designed to carry our messages to a wide range of Singaporeans. In addition to a focus on traditional media, we enlisted the support of Telstra to fashion our social media strategy. The result is a microsite that showcases artists' work as it is produced, and is a platform inviting imaginative interaction by Singaporeans in the program.
- 4. In terms of content, "50 Bridges has three elements:
- " "50 Walls". A program of street art (or "public art" as we are pitching it to avoid Singaporean sensitivities). Ten Australian artists and two Singaporeans are painting 50 individual walls, mostly in "heartlands" locations with a focus on environments that ordinary Singaporeans frequent such as wet markets and hawker markets. Substantial effort is going in to ensure that images do not offend Singapore sensitivities, which has proved time-consuming, but is being managed. s.22(1)(a)(ii)



- 8. This is a major undertaking. We have been fortunate to have the involvement of \$.47F(1) s.47F(1) the Artistic Director for "50 Bridges", who is a gallerist formerly based in Singapore and now resident in Melbourne. We are also grateful for the support that DFAT Canberra has provided, firstly through the Senior Executive's provision of \$50,000 in seed funding for the project (which has borne much fruit from our commercial partners); and latterly through SED staffing support for a short term mission to help deliver the project. We are also conscious of the flexibility that OPO and other parts of the department's logistical arms have shown to make "50 Bridges" work.
- 9. While there is much work still going on to ensure "50 Bridges" runs successfully, it is shaping to be a major foreign contribution to Singapore's 50th. Indeed, together with the s.22(1)(a)(ii) Australia's contribution to Singapore's 50th is set to be the most substantial of any foreign government. This will provide an excellent backdrop for major visits this year, and ballast for our efforts to drive a higher level of engagement with Singapore through the comprehensive strategic partnership.
- 10. Finally, HOM wishes to place on record the tremendous effort made by all parts of the High Commission for what is shaping to be a successful and historic project. Credit is due all around to A-based and locally engaged staff, from the Pol/Eco, Admin and Public Affairs sections, impressively choreographed by Deputy High Commissioner Adrian Lochrin. It has been (and continues to be) an excellent team effort.



# **'50 Bridges' program** s.22(1)(a)(ii)

### **Key Issues**

- In 2015 the Australian High Commission in Singapore collaborated with Singaporean artists, businesses and community associations to deliver a high profile public arts and community engagement program.
- Collectively referred to as '50 Bridges', the program celebrated the **50th** anniversary of Singapore's independence and the **50th** anniversary of Singapore-Australia bilateral relations.

- The program was funded through the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and the **generous support of the Australian business community**.
- Singapore is a key Australian partner in trade, investment, defence and security, and last year our two countries formalised a Comprehensive Strategic Partnership that will build further on our cooperation and collaboration over the next decade.

### '50 Bridges'

The program was delivered in May – June 2015 and focused on community 'heartland' venues. The 'soft launch' took place on the 17 April 2015. Minister Bishop officially launched the program on 20 May 2015.

    - o On 23 September 2015, the Governor-General applied the finishing touches to a mural in Clementi West painted on a 12 storey Housing Development Board building by Melbourne-based artist Matt Adnate. The Governor-General and Lady Cosgrove were guests of Minister S. Iswaran—an Australian alumnus.


