I am writing regarding outstanding traffic infringements incurred in the ACT by vehicles registered to your mission or mission staff.

The attached itemised report from Access Canberra shows your mission's position as at 2 December 2022. I am very keen to work with you to bring your mission's outstanding fines to zero. This is particularly the case given your mission has by far the largest accrued debt of any mission in the ACT. If the driver of a vehicle incurring any infringement has departed Australia, kindly provide details to s 22(1)(a)(ii) @dfat.gov.au and we will assist you to seek a withdrawal of relevant fines through Access Canberra. You will be aware that any request for the disposal or transfer of a diplomatic plated vehicle will only be granted once outstanding infringement notices have been accounted for.

We encourage missions and their staff to avoid traffic infringements and pay any fines incurred promptly. As you are aware, road safety is a matter for signification community concern in Australia. We would also appreciate if you could remind staff and their dependants of their responsibility under Article 41.1 of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations to respect Australia's laws and regulations.

I also note that under freedom of information laws, if formally requested by any non-government entity, the Australian Government may be legally required to release copies of any reports and correspondence relating to diplomatic mission's traffic infringements and unpaid fines to the public, including the media.

We encourage missions and their staff to avoid traffic infringements and pay any fines incurred promptly. As you are aware, road safety is a matter for signification community concern in Australia. We would also appreciate if you could remind staff and their dependants of their responsibility under Article 41.1 of the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations to respect Australia's laws and regulations.

I also note that under freedom of information laws, if formally requested by any non-government entity, the Australian Government may be legally required to release copies of any reports and correspondence relating to diplomatic mission's traffic infringements and unpaid fines to the public, including the media.
