

### General Assembly resolution on Palestinian membership of the UN

- On 10 May, Australia voted in support of a General Assembly resolution granting the Palestinians a modest extension of rights to participate in the UN as a non-member observer state
  - Australia was with the overwhelming majority of the international community, some 143 countries, in voting for the resolution.
- Australia's vote in favour reflects our unwavering support for a two-state solution and Palestinian aspirations for self-determination.
- The resolution expands Palestinian participation in the UN, while retaining the observer status of the Palestinian mission
  - $_{\odot}\;$  it does not give the Palestinians membership of the UN or voting rights at the UN General Assembly
  - $_{\odot}~$  the process to become a UN member remains unchanged a Security Council recommendation is necessary for admission, consistent with the UN Charter.

- The resolution reaffirms the international community's support for a twostate solution – Israel and a future Palestinian state, living side by side in peace and security within internationally recognised borders.
- Like many other countries, our vote for this resolution does not constitute bilateral recognition of Palestinian statehood.

### Multilateral implications of the UNGA vote

If asked: Will Australia support Palestinian membership of other UN Bodies?

• Australia will consider any membership requests based on the merits of the proposal and in the context of the rules and procedures of the relevant UN body.

If asked: Will Australia support Palestinian candidates in UNGA/committee elections?

• Australia will continue to carefully consider the slate of candidates for each and every election in the plenary of the General Assembly and its Main Committees.

If asked: Will the US withdraw UN funding based on this expansion of Palestinian rights?

• This is a matter for the US.

#### **Recognising a Palestinian state**

- The international community is now considering the question of Palestinian statehood as a way of building momentum towards a two-state solution.
- Australia has long believed that a two-state solution offers the only hope for breaking this endless cycle of violence and achieving lasting peace
  - $_{\odot}\,$  with Israelis and Palestinians living side by side in peace and security and recognising each other's right to exist.
- Australia no longer believes recognition can only come at the end of a peace process
  - $_{\odot}~$  it could occur as part of a peace process, when we think the time is right. We urge all parties to return to the negotiating table
  - we are engaging to support all efforts to advance a political process
  - it is clear that final status issues, such as Jerusalem and future borders, must be agreed through negotiations.

If asked: What would be needed for Australia to recognise a Palestinian state?

- •—Australia will be guided by whether recognition will advance the cause of peace and progress toward a two-state solution.
- We want to see a reformed Palestinian governing authority that is committed to peace, that disavows violence and is ready to engage in a meaningful political process.
- We want to see a commitment to peace in how the Palestinian Authority leads its people.
- We want to see a reformed Palestinian Authority capable of representing

the entire Occupied Palestinian Territories

• At the same time, Israel cannot continue to take unilateral action to entrench the occupation and prevent a viable Palestinian state.

#### If asked: Would recognising a Palestinian state reward Hamas?

- No—a two-state solution is the opposite of what Hamas wants.
- Hamas does not want peace and it does not want long term security for the state of Israel nor for the Palestinian people.
- Hamas is a terrorist organisation that has the explicit intent of the destruction of the state of Israel and the Jewish people.



### **Background:**

On 2 April, the Palestinian Authority asked the UN Secretary-General to reopen its 2011 application for full UN membership. UN membership requires two steps: (1) UNSC approval of at least nine states and no P5 veto; and (2) UNGA approval with a two-thirds majority of those present and voting. On 18 April, the US vetoed an Arab Group UNSC resolution recommending UN membership. The issue then moved to UNGA on a twin-track: (1) a debate on 1 May under the Veto Initiative (Australia spoke on procedural issues); and (2) an Emergency Special Session (ESS) on substance, scheduled for 10 May. 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



- 7. EOVs after the vote
- 8. Debate
