Post has received a copy of the outstanding blood test results (appears to be for three of the four affected Australians) which we believe shows no methanol or illicit drugs. s 33(a)(iii)

In the meantime, HOM has asked for CCD's advice on updating the travel advice so we have a cleared version ready to go. He's keen to know if CCD recommends reverting to our previous travel advice (prior to this incident occurring) <u>or</u> moving to one of the options proposed by ^{*20000} in the below email chain. I suppose the primary considerations for either reverting to the previous or changing the travel advice are: the test results are not showing methanol or illicit drugs as the cause; this is an isolated incident at one resort; and we still don't know the cause.

HOM has cleared the update to Fiji travel advice as per ^{s22(1)(a)(ii)} email below, subject to FMO views (thanks ^{s22(1)(a)(ii)}) This is on the basis that I have just spoken to Lautoka Hospital who has confirmed they are treating this incident as suspected methanol poisoning. A summary of my conversation is below. Lautoka Hospital s 22(1)(a)(ii)

advised:

- There appears to be six to seven patients across Lautoka Hospital and Sigatoka Hospital (awaiting confirmation of patient numbers at Sigatoka Hospital)
 - two incubated patients in ICU at Lautoka Hospital both are critically ill and on life support ^{\$22(1)(a)(ii)}
 - four or five patients at Sigatoka Hospital (three Australians s 22(1)(a)(ii)

; one US citizen; potentially one local expat whose nationality is unknown)

- Lautoka Hospital suspects methanol poisoning for all patients, however toxicology results will be an extended process as reports will be passed onto the Fiji Police Force as part of the investigation. They are unable to provide a timeframe on when results/reports will be released.
- Lautoka Hospital is arranging for all patients at Sigatoka Hospital to be transferred to Lautoka Hospital as soon as possible, aiming for today or tomorrow at the latest.
- Updates will be provided to post as the situation develops further.



At a brief press conference on 18 December, Fiji Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Tourism, Viliame Gavoka, announced that tests conducted by the Fiji Police Force found no evidence of illicit drugs or methanol in the drinks served to seven people, including four Australians, at the Warwick resort on Saturday night (14 December). Fijian Health Secretary James Tudravu did not reveal the cause of the illnesses, nor the results of the samples taken from the patients — only samples from the tainted drinks. The toxicology tests for the seven affected people are still under way. Officials indicated the detail from that investigation will first be provided to the individuals affected before it is made public.

The seven people affected had presented with symptoms including nausea and vomiting, intestinal issues, as well as some neurological symptoms. The toxicology testing is examining whether it was a chemical issue or an infection. PS Tudravu said that further investigations are ongoing to get the definitive cause. DPM Gavoka said that all of the affected tourists and the local Fijian affected have now been discharged from medical care, and fully recovered.

In the meantime, HOM has asked for CCD's advice on updating the travel advice so we have a cleared version ready to go. He's keen to know if CCD recommends reverting to our previous travel advice (prior to this incident occurring) <u>or</u> moving to one of the options proposed by ^{azelief} in the below email chain. I suppose the primary considerations for either reverting to the previous or changing the travel advice are: the test results are not showing methanol or illicit drugs as the cause; this is an isolated incident at one resort; and we still don't know the cause.
