Sanctions on the ICC

- It is in Australia's interests for international law to be upheld, globally and in our own region.
- Australia's longstanding position is that we respect the independence of the International Criminal Court; and its role in upholding international law.

If asked: Australia not joining the statement in support of the ICC by a number of States Parties

- Australia is a longstanding supporter of the ICC. That position has not changed.
- We have made multiple statements on our support for the ICC; and continue to reiterate that support.

If pressed: Australians working in the ICC
