Background

The **Traditional Inhabitants Meeting** (TIM) is convened to support bilateral traditional inhabitant interaction on Treaty issues. The TIM meets annually, with an agenda determined by traditional inhabitants. The Treaty Liaison Officers act as Secretariat to this meeting which has representative attendance from traditional inhabitant leaders (ie 4 -6 delegates each Party).

Objective

To respond to any PNG proposal in relation to the PNG Review of Treaty Villages – also referred to as the Aspirant Village process.

Talking Points

- . Australia supports a balanced process for assessing any claims from PNG villages within the Treaty area (up to the 9 degree latitude) which were not included on the 2000 Treaty Village Free Movement List..
- . Recognise that the Treaty Village List, agreed in 2000, left open the possibility of further additions or amendments, provided these were agreed by the Parties.

. These villages are referred to as Treaty Villages and are listed in Table 1 below. The majority of these villages are situated on the coast adjacent to the Torres Strait, with the exception of Sui (located east of Daru, on the west bank of the Fly River estuary) and Tais (located near the PNG-Indonesian border several kilometres inland from the Torres Strait coast).
