

Hi Colleagues

We had an enquiry from a post on the correct order for displaying official portraits, if they were to display The King's portrait.

DFAT's policy is to display the GG, PM, and portfolio Minister's portraits. No change to that policy. If posts wish to display The King's portrait based on local sensitives etc, then that is a post decision.

Honours and Symbols Section, Parliamentary and Government Branch, Government Division, Department of the Prime Minister and Cabinet have advised:

As the Governor-General is The King's representative in Australia, His Majesty should take precedence in a portrait display. As such, we would recommend placing it on the left of the Governor-General or above the set of three portraits (GG, PM, Minister).

Alternatively, the portrait of The King could be displayed on a separate wall.
