Key messages

- The Australian Government is aware of Israeli and US strikes on Iran.
- We are monitoring the situation closely.
- Australians in the region should follow Smartraveller for the latest advice, which has been updated today.
- Australians in need of emergency consular assistance should contact the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade's 24-hour Consular Emergency Centre on 1300 555 135, or +61 2 6261 3305 (if calling from overseas).
- The Iranian regime has long posed a threat to its own people, to the region, and to international peace and security
 - through its ballistic missile and nuclear programs, support for armed proxies, and brutal acts of violence and intimidation inside and outside Iran.
- US President Trump made clear in his statement today that the Iranian regime's horrific abuses cannot continue.

Consular

- We continue to urge all Australians in Iran to leave as soon as possible
 - be prepared to shelter in place for an extended period - make sure you have supplies of food, water and medication.
- Our ability to provide consular services in Iran is extremely limited
 - the Australian Embassy's operations are suspended.
- We urge Australians in the Middle East region to be alert to developments, including retaliatory action
 - as reflected in travel advice, conflict will affect airport operations and airspace

expect flight cancellations and disruption to travel.

- Travellers should prioritise their safety, monitor events and follow local advice.
