BACKGROUND

Select Committee on Foreign Interference through Social Media

On 17 July 2023, Senator Paterson released a media statement noting that Senate Select Committee on Foreign Interference through Social Media had sent WeChat a series of 53 questions after it failed to appear before the committee to give evidence, giving WeChat until Friday 21 July 2023 to provide a response.

On 5 December 2019, the Senate resolved to establish a Select Committee on Foreign Interference through social media to inquire into and report on the risk posed to Australia's democracy by foreign interference through social media.

The Select Committee with particular reference to:

- the use of social media for purposes that undermine Australia's democracy and values, including the spread of misinformation;
- responses to mitigate the risk posed to Australia's democracy and values, including by the Australian Government and social media platforms;
- international policy responses to cyber-enabled foreign interference and misinformation;
- the extent of compliance with Australian laws; and
- any related matters.

The committee tabled an interim report on 17 December 2021 and a progress report on 21 April 2022. Due to the calling of the 2022 Federal Election, the Select Committee on Foreign Interference through Social Media was dissolved with the committee was unable to complete its inquiry and final report as intended. The committee recommended the Senate consider whether to re-establish the committee in the following Parliament, with provision to access the documents and evidence of this committee, to enable the inquiry to be completed.

A new Select Committee on Foreign Interference through Social Media was established in the 47th Parliament on 24 November 2022.

The submissions closing date was 17 February 2023.

The committee is scheduled to present its final report by 1 August 2023.

Data and national security risks posed by TikTok

On 26 March 60 Minutes reported on the data protection and national security risks posed by TikTok. Senator James Paterson appeared on the program, and was quoted in the associated Nine article saying he was "genuinely mystified why it is taking the Albanese government so long to take the first and most basic step to address the serious national security risks posed by TikTok. Banning it from government devices — as all of our closest allies have done — is the lowest hanging fruit'.

On 25 March the Australian Financial Review reported that analysis of Tik Tok code reveals the app collects GPS location data of users which TikTok had previously told the AFR it did not collect. In a submission to the Senate's Select Committee on Foreign Interference through Social Media, John Garnaut (a former journalist at The Age and The Sydney Morning Herald) said the Chinese Communist Party could use TikTok to influence public discourse, in addition to the application's controversial data-gathering technology.

Garnaut's submission draws on analysis of Chinese-language sources and archived internet material and states that "TikTok provides Beijing with the latent capability to weaponise the platform by suppressing, amplifying and otherwise calibrating narratives in ways that microtarget political constituencies abroad." Senator James Paterson, Chair of the Select Committee, said the Garnaut submission "shatters the myth this is somehow a private company operating on a normal commercial basis [and] makes a mockery of TikTok's lame defence that they would refuse to co-operate with Chinese intelligence agencies if asked."

- DFAT, as is common for many other government departments, regularly engages Parliamentary Committees
 on questions of process and operations.
- In this instance, DFAT reached out to the Committee secretariat to clarify its powers to compel a foreign company to participate in a committee process.

Did Chinese officials complain to DFAT about the Senate Select Committee on Foreign Interference in Social Media Inquiry?

- Robust and independent parliamentary processes are a normal and important part of Australian democracy.
- Chinese officials occasionally discuss with Australian officials the impact regulatory and parliamentary processes can have on Chinese entities.
- DFAT takes opportunities to reinforce understanding about Australia's parliamentary processes when engaging foreign officials.
- China is well aware of the strong interest the Australian Government has in addressing possible foreign interference risks of social media.
- The Government will decide on how it responds to any Committee recommendations in due course.


