Supplementary talking points

HMAS Toowoomba – PLA-N maritime incident in the East China Sea

- The Australian Government is seriously concerned about ongoing unsafe and unprofessional incidents by China at sea and in the air
 - including an incident on 14 November 2023 while the HMAS *Toowoomba* was in Japan's EEZ enroute to a scheduled port visit
 - when HMAS Toowoomba stopped to clear fishing nets from its propellers, a PLA-N destroyer disregarded requests to stay clear, approached to a close range and operated hull-mounted sonar in a manner that posed a risk to the safety of the Australian, who were forced to exit the water
 - this kind of behaviour endangers safety, security and creates risks of miscalculation.
- The Australian Government raised its serious concerns directly with the Government of the People's Republic of China, and more broadly through a statement by the Deputy Prime Minister and Minister for Defence, the Hon. Richard Marles MP.
- As Mr Marles said, "Australia expects all countries, including China, to operate their militaries in a professional and safe manner.
- Australian vessels and aircraft will continue to contribute to UN sanctions enforcement operations in the East China Sea, and exercise freedom of navigation and overflight in the South China Sea, as we have done for decades
 - we will continue to act in our national interest to support a region which is stable, secure and respectful of sovereignty.
- Australia wants to see a peaceful Indo-Pacific, where international law is respected and adhered to, and waterways are open for trade
 - our actions are guided by our desire to support our partners, enhance maritime security and uphold international law.
- It is vital Australia, India and our partners call out behaviour that is dangerous and inconsistent with international law, particularly the UN Convention on the Law of the Sea.

Background

On Tuesday 14 November 2023, HMAS *Toowoomba* experienced an unsafe and unprofessional interaction with a People's Liberation Army-Navy (PLA-N) destroyer. *Toowoomba* was stopped in the water to conduct diving operations in the East China Sea, in order to clear fishing nets that had become entangled around its propellers. HMAS *Toowoomba* was in international waters inside Japan's Exclusive Economic Zone and this activity is routine for an Australian ship operating in the region.

HMAS *Toowoomba* was operating in support of Operation ARGOS, the Australian Defence Force (ADF) commitment to the international effort to enforce United Nations Security Council sanctions on North Korea.

Toowoomba advised the PLA-N destroyer via all normal maritime communications channels that diving operations were being conducted and requested the vessel remain outside a range of 3 nautical miles (5.5kms).

Despite acknowledging *Toowoomba*'s communications, the destroyer closed to a range of 1.3 nautical miles (2.4kms).

Toowoomba again requested the destroyer remain no closer than 2 nautical miles. After acknowledging Toowoomba's request, the destroyer closed to a range of 1580 yards (1.4kms).

While diving operations were under way when the PLA-N destroyer was at a range of 2400 yards (2.2km), *Toowoomba* detected acoustic transmissions, correlated to the PLA-N destroyer's hull-mounted sonar.

Following the incident, divers reported mild headaches and eardrum irritation and received appropriate medical care and treatment. One diver has been diagnosed with mild (grade 2) aural barotrauma. Current medical advice indicates no long-term health impacts are expected.

Defence assessed the incident as unsafe and unprofessional conduct for mariners due to the Chinese warship repeatedly closing inside the requested range, and operating sonar with clear knowledge that there were divers in the water with disregard for their safety.
