AGREEMENT

Between

**The Government of Australia represented by the Australian Agency for International
Development (AusAID)**

And

The International Institute for Educational Planning hereinafter called IIEP

regarding a financial contribution of the Government of Australia, represented by AusAID.

AusAID has decided to grant IIEP, established within the framework of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), with a financial contribution to be used to support IIEP's core programme. The contribution will be paid into the IIEP special account created by the Director-General of UNESCO.

The parties agree as follows:

Article I

1. The total amount of the contribution under this Agreement will be **360,000** Australian dollars over a three-year period (2011-2013).
2. The contribution shall be transferred into the IIEP account in three installments of **120,000** Australian dollars each: the first upon signature of the Agreement, the second no later than 30 June 2012, and the third no later than 30 June 2013. The contribution will be credited to IIEP's special account, under the item "Voluntary Contributions", in the equivalent amount of United States Dollars.
3. Funds made available by AusAID shall be subject to the internal and external auditing procedures as provided for in the financial regulations, rules and directives of IIEP.

Article II

1. IIEP will use the contribution: (i) for support to IIEP's permanent tasks and core activities (grant-in-aid) and (ii) for support to inter-regional and regional programmes on Education For All and strengthening of institutional capacity in educational planning and management within the framework of the IIEP Medium-Term Plan.
2. IIEP will hold an annual meeting with countries/agencies supporting IIEP through voluntary contributions to coordinate reporting and to jointly review and discuss priorities for the future programme.
3. After this annual consultation, IIEP will send to AusAID no later than 31 March of each year under this Agreement, the Annual Programme and Budget approved by its Governing board.

Article III

1. As soon as approved by its Governing Board, but no later than 31 March of each year, IIEP will submit to AusAID, the IIEP Annual Report covering activities for the previous year, as submitted by its Director, in as much as IIEP will have benefited from the Government of Australia's contribution during that year.
2. By April of each year under this Agreement, IIEP will submit to AusAID, a financial report concerning the use made of the voluntary contributions received from Donors, including that of the Government of Australia during the preceding year. This report will be expressed in United States Dollars and will duly be certified by two IIEP staff members responsible for IIEP finances.
3. IIEP shall, as far as it is within its power, enable representatives of AusAID to visit and study the various activities of relevance for the Government of Australia's follow-up of its contribution and the programmes' impact.

Article V

1. This Agreement will enter into force upon signature and will remain in force until 30 June 2013.
2. This Agreement may be amended or modified at any time. Any amendments or modifications shall be made by mutual consent and in writing.
3. This Agreement may be terminated by both parties provided written notice is given by the party concerned at least six months prior to the desired date for the termination.
4. In the case of termination by AusAID, IIEP shall not be obliged to repay any funds irrevocably committed in good faith by IIEP to third parties before the date of notice of termination.
5. This Agreement is not governed by international law and any dispute between its parties over its interpretation or application (or both) is not justifiable.
6. If any dispute arises in relation to this MOU that cannot be resolved in a mutually satisfactory manner, both parties agree to select a mutually acceptable third party to act as Mediator in the dispute.

Article VI

Consistent with UN Security Council Resolutions relating to terrorism, including UNSC Resolution 1373 (2001) and 1267 (1999) and related resolutions, both AusAID and IIEP are firmly committed to the international fight against terrorism, and in particular, against the financing of terrorism. It is the policy of AusAID to seek to ensure that none of its funds are used, directly or indirectly, to provide support to individuals or entities associated with terrorism. In accordance with this policy, IIEP undertakes to use all reasonable efforts to ensure that none of AusAID's funds provided under this Agreement are used to provide support to individuals or entities associated with terrorism. If, during the course of this Agreement, IIEP discovers a link with any organisation or individual associated with terrorism it will inform AusAID immediately.
