Ocean governance:

- Supporting the Pacific Ocean Commissioner and their role in oceans governance, management and advocacy
- Joining the Pacific, and other countries, to agree the historic High Seas Treaty, which provides a new framework for the conservation and sustainable use of approximately 60% of the world's oceans
- Recognising the important contribution of the Commonwealth Blue Charter to progress towards Sustainable Development Goal 14: Life Below Water

Marine ecosystems:

- Protecting and restoring coastal blue carbon ecosystems to mitigate climate change through nature-based solutions and improving coral reef monitoring and management
- Investing in regional initiatives to address waste
 management challenges, including phasing out single
 use plastics through the Pacific Ocean Litter Project and
 supporting Pacific island countries in negotiations for
 a new global plastics treaty

Ocean science:

- Enhancing the Pacific's capacity to monitor, analyse and communicate climate and oceans information through the Climate and Ocean Support Program in the Pacific
- Participating in global and regional ocean observation efforts to inform decision-makers on the impact of climate change, warming and acidification on the ocean
