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# Introduction

The objective of Australian Government's international development cooperation program is to advance Australia's national interest by assisting developing countries to reduce poverty and achieve sustainable development. The international development cooperation program continues to focus on assisting developing countries in the Asia-Pacific, for both development and national interest reasons.

*Australia's International Development Cooperation Program Statistical Summary* (commonly known as the "Green Book") provides a comprehensive summary of Australian Government expenditure on international development cooperation. It is produced to provide statistical information about the international development cooperation program to a wider audience.

## Sources of data

The international development cooperation statistics in the *Statistical Summary* are primarily sourced from AusAID databases and are based on data extracted in January 2004. Any revisions made to historical data after January 2004 will be reflected in future publications.

Additional sources of information include other Commonwealth Government departments, State Government departments and voluntary agencies (non government organisations).

Some supplementary data on other donor countries' development assistance has been included in the publication. This data has been sourced from the OECD Development Assistance Committee's (DAC) statistics. These can be accessed through the DAC's web site at [www.oecd.org/dac](http://www.oecd.org/dac).

## Concepts

The concepts referred to throughout this publication are defined in the glossary in Appendix 1.

The main focus of the publication is to provide a range of statistics on international development cooperation. The definitions used in this publication are consistent with those of the DAC of the OECD. Appendix 3 provides some information on the different methodology used in this publication and the Aid Budget Statement.

In some tables the distinction is made between Official Development Assistance (ODA) and Official Assistance (OA). The country income groupings used to make this distinction are given in Appendix 2.

This publication includes information on the ODA/GNI ratio. In 1998, the Australian Bureau of Statistics changed its method of calculating national income, from Gross National Product (GNP) to Gross National Income (GNI) in line with international standards. Generally, GNI figures are slightly higher than corresponding GNP figures.

Much of the statistical information in the publication is broken down into AusAID programs. The program element is a detailed classification reflecting AusAID's program structure, as outlined in Appendix 4.

Other tables give the sectoral breakdown of the international development cooperation. The DAC sector code is an indication of the primary sector benefiting from a particular project. All projects, both AusAID and those managed by other Government Department, have been classified according to their DAC sector.

A list of abbreviations used throughout the publication is included in Appendix 5.

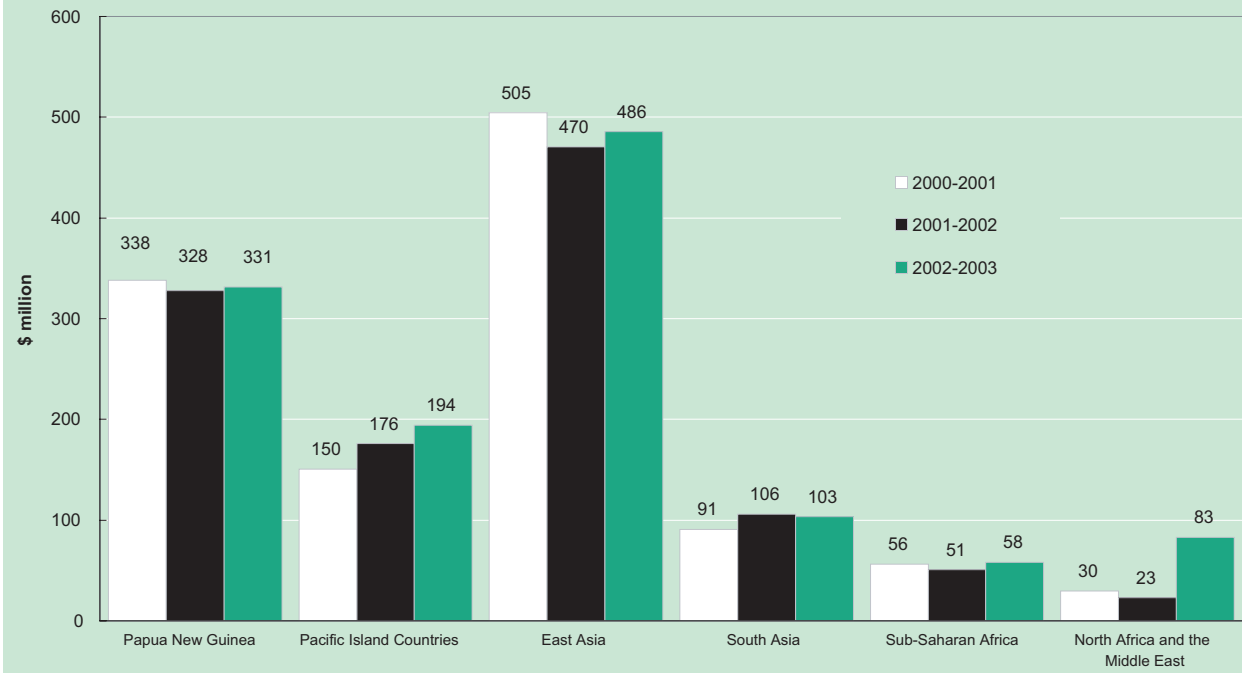

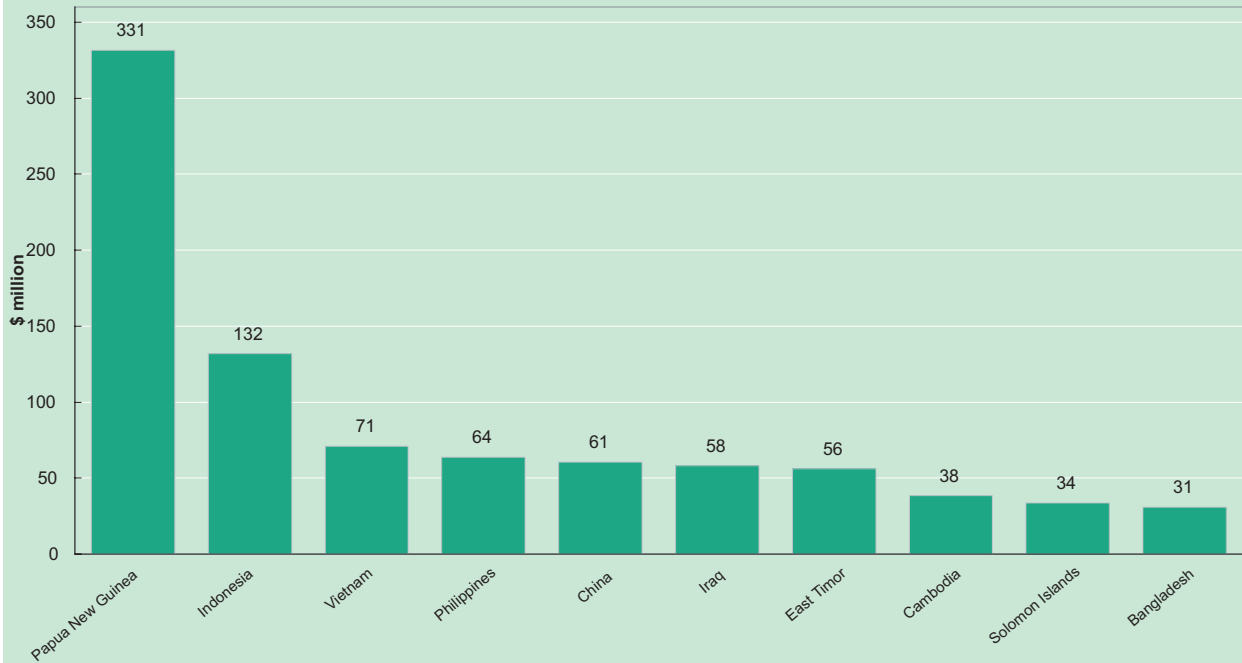

**Diagram 1: Australia's international development cooperation by region, 2000-2001 to 2002-2003**

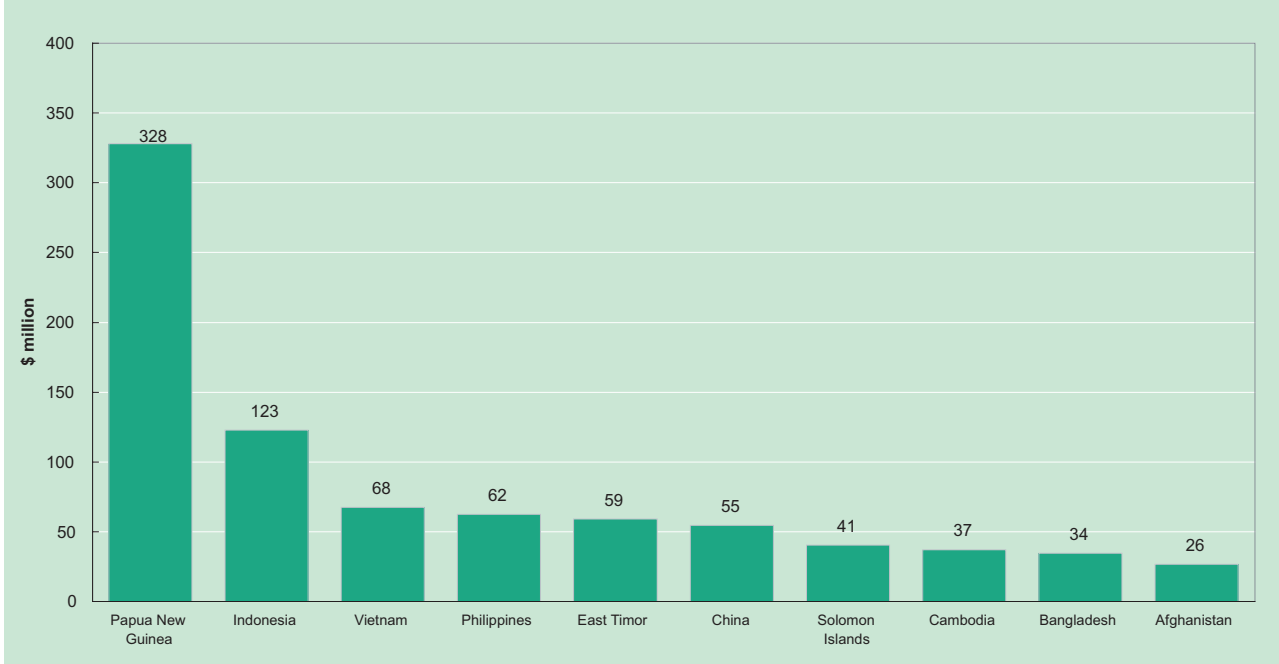


**Diagram 2: Australia's international development cooperation with major partner countries <sup>(a)</sup>, 2002-2003**



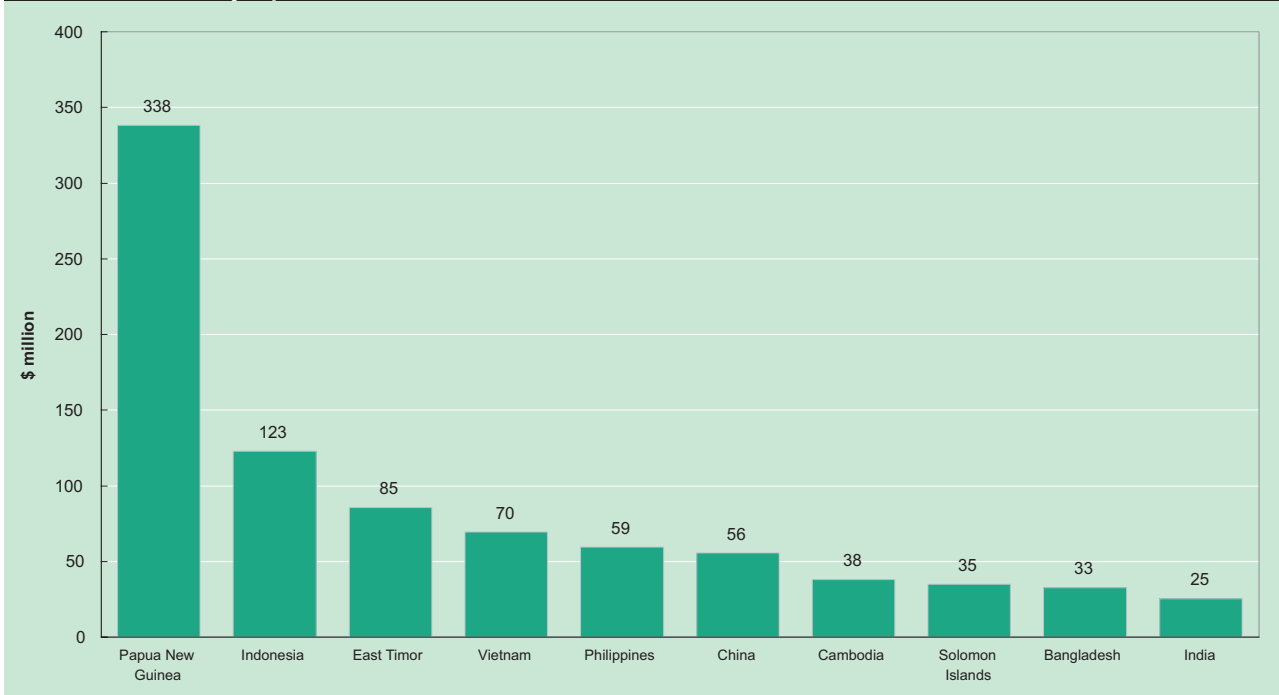

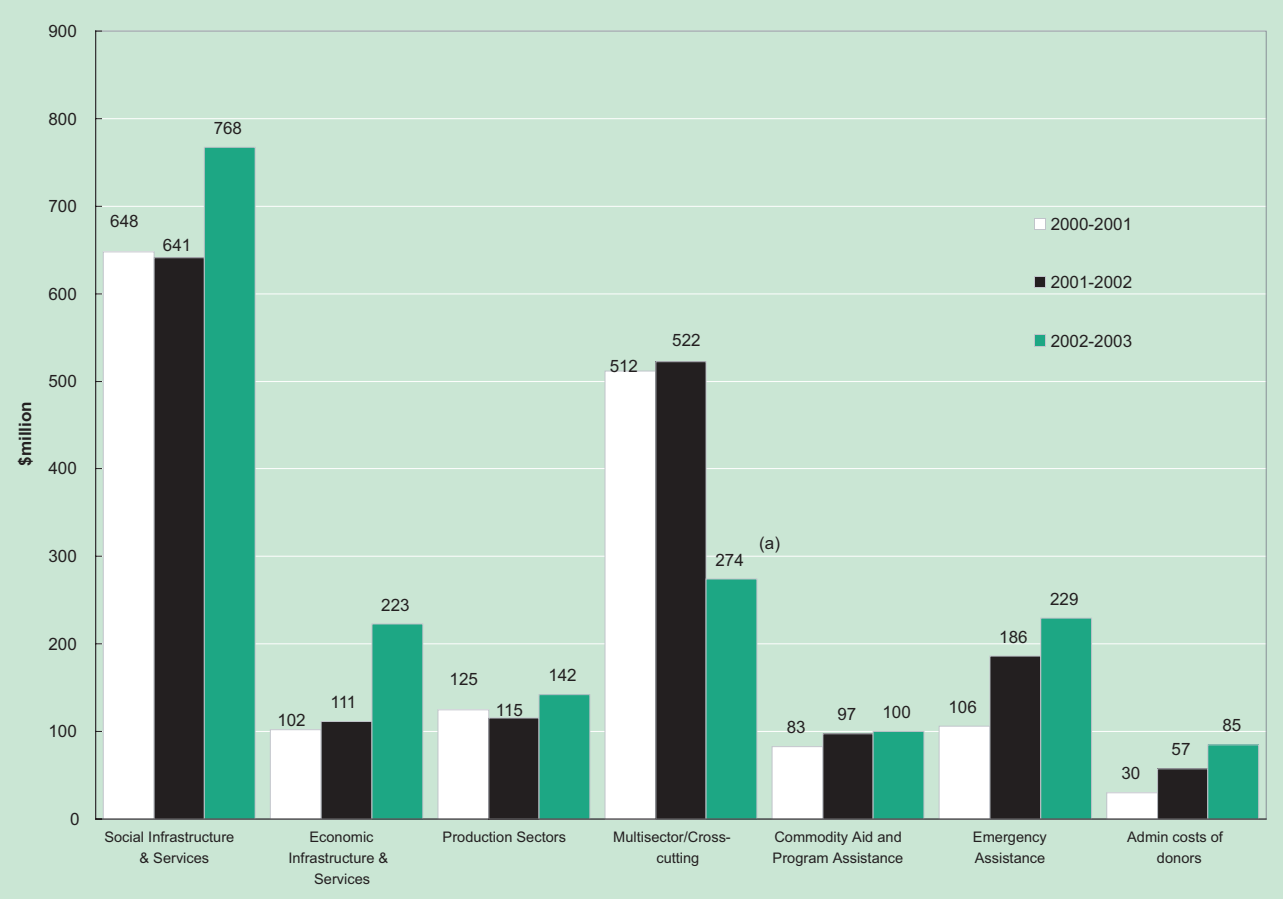

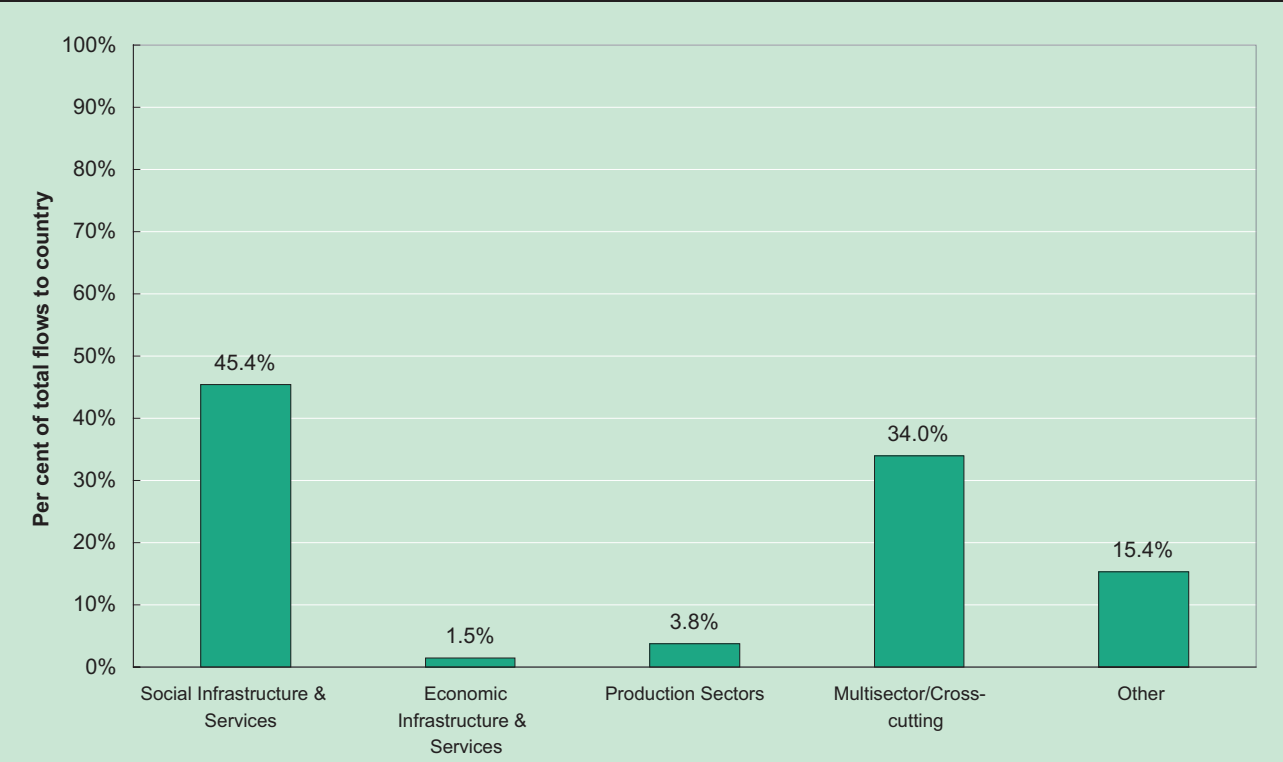

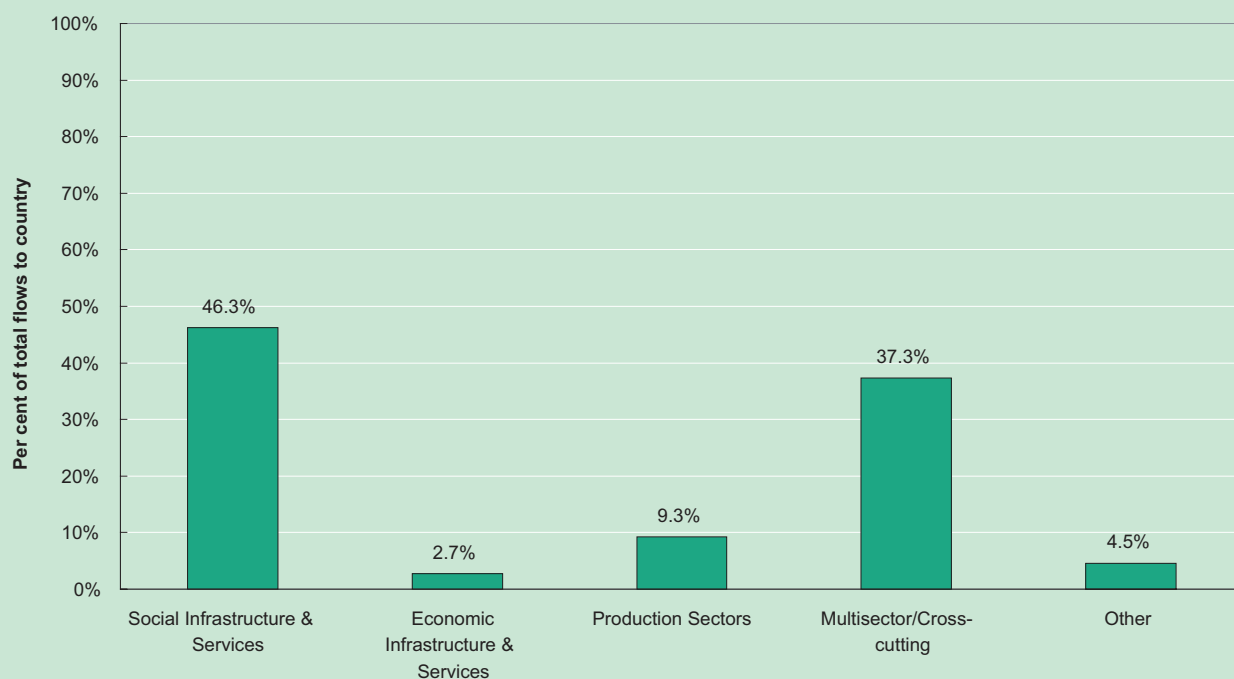
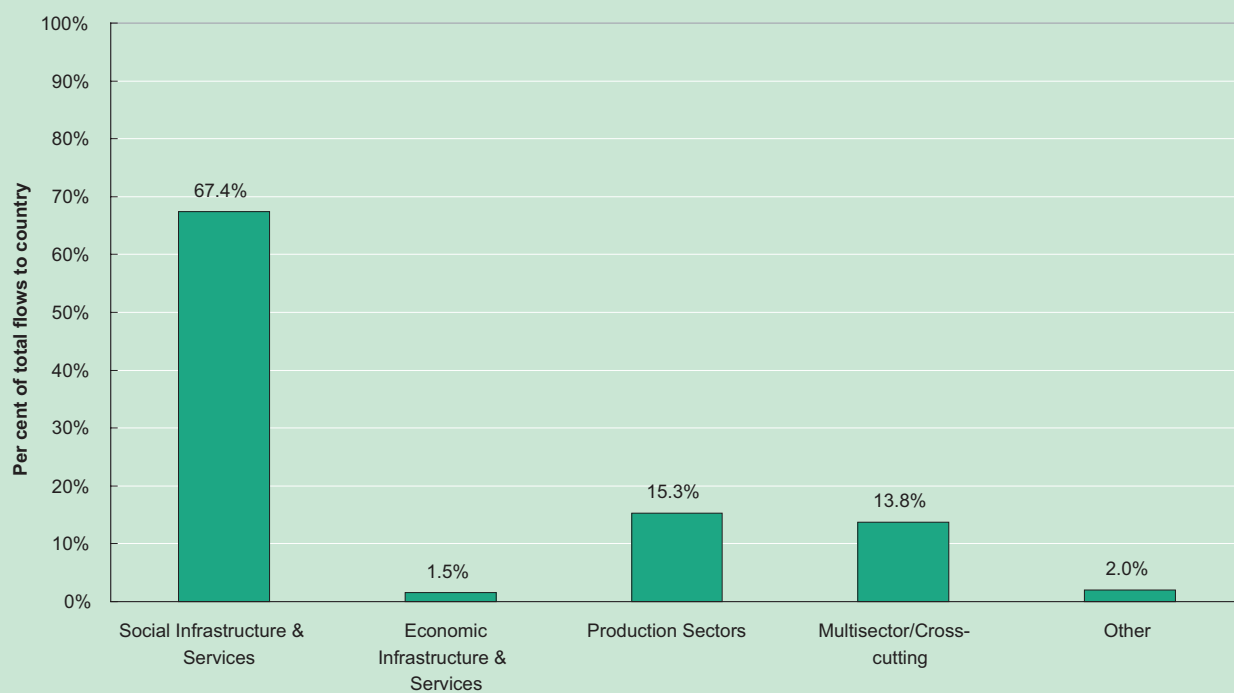

**Diagram 6.1: Papua New Guinea, 2002-2003**



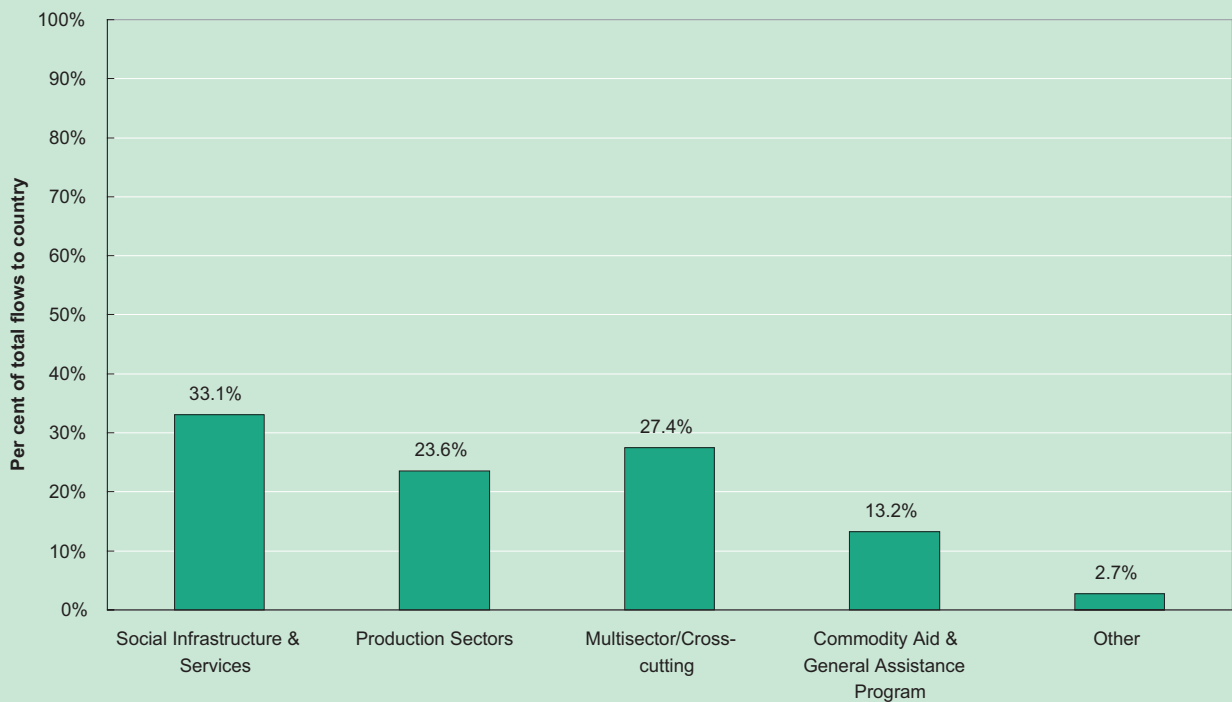
**Diagram 6.2: Indonesia, 2002-2003**

**Diagram 6.6: Iraq, 2002-2003**

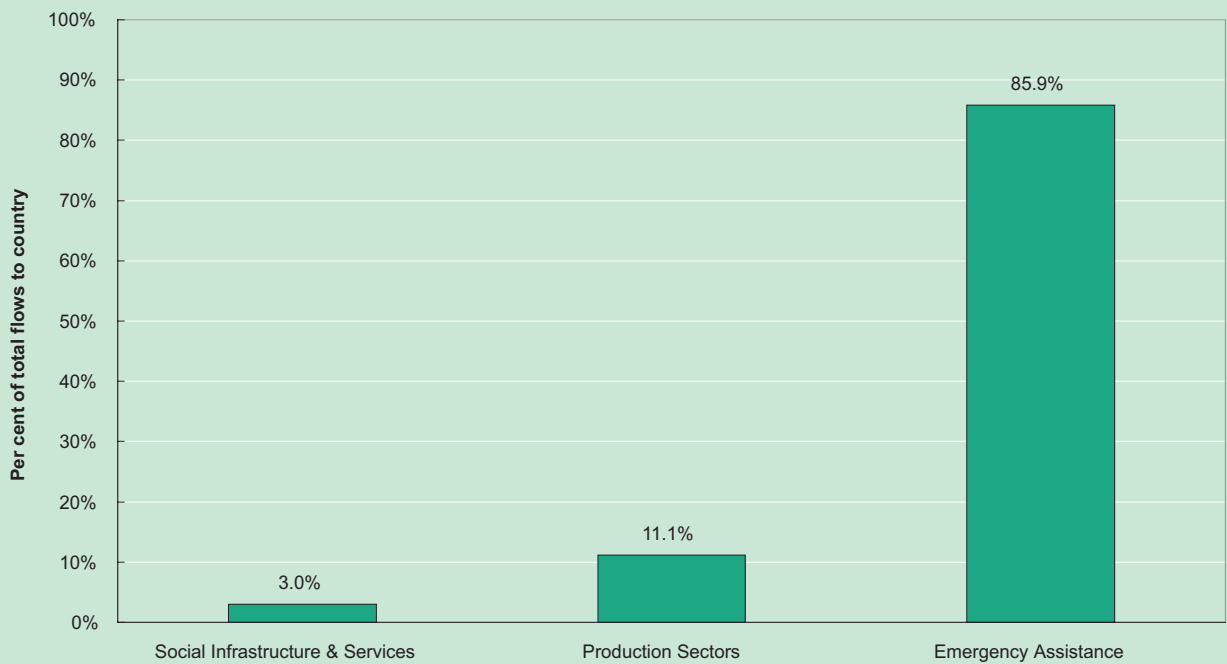


Diagram 6.7: East Timor, 2002-2003

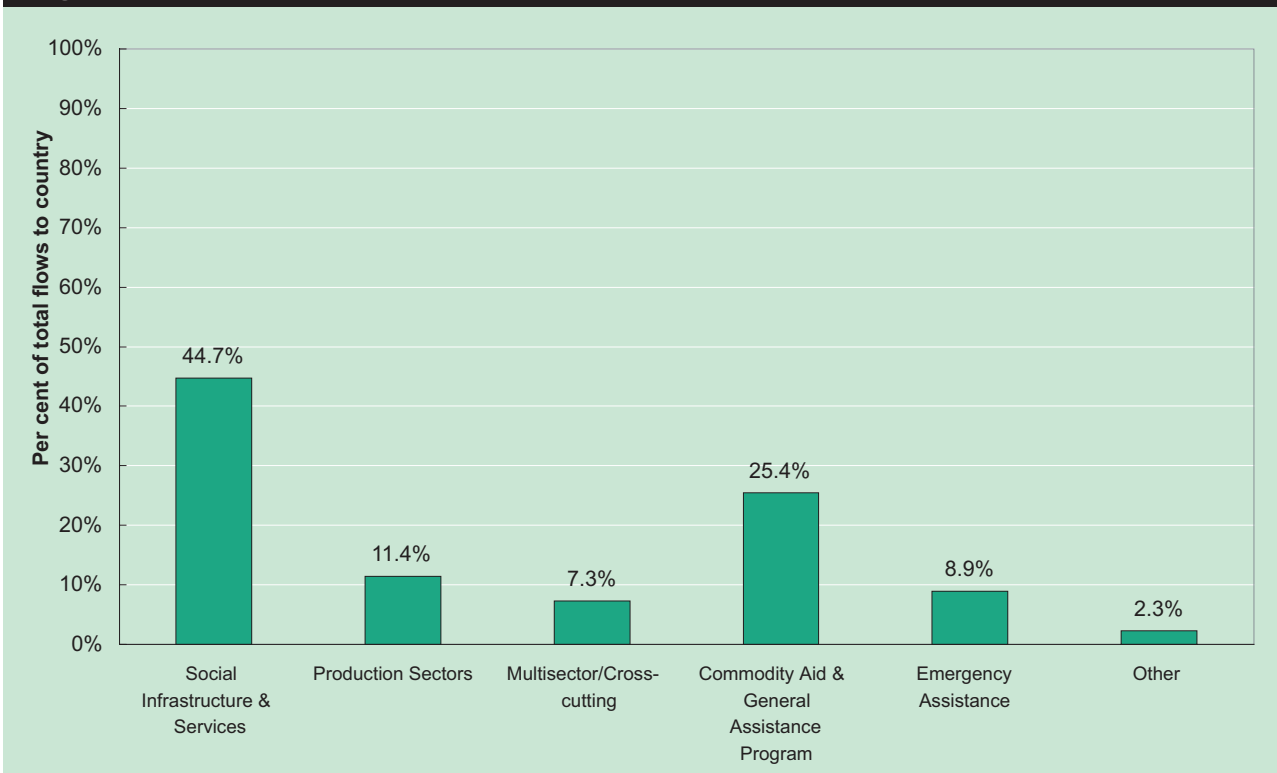
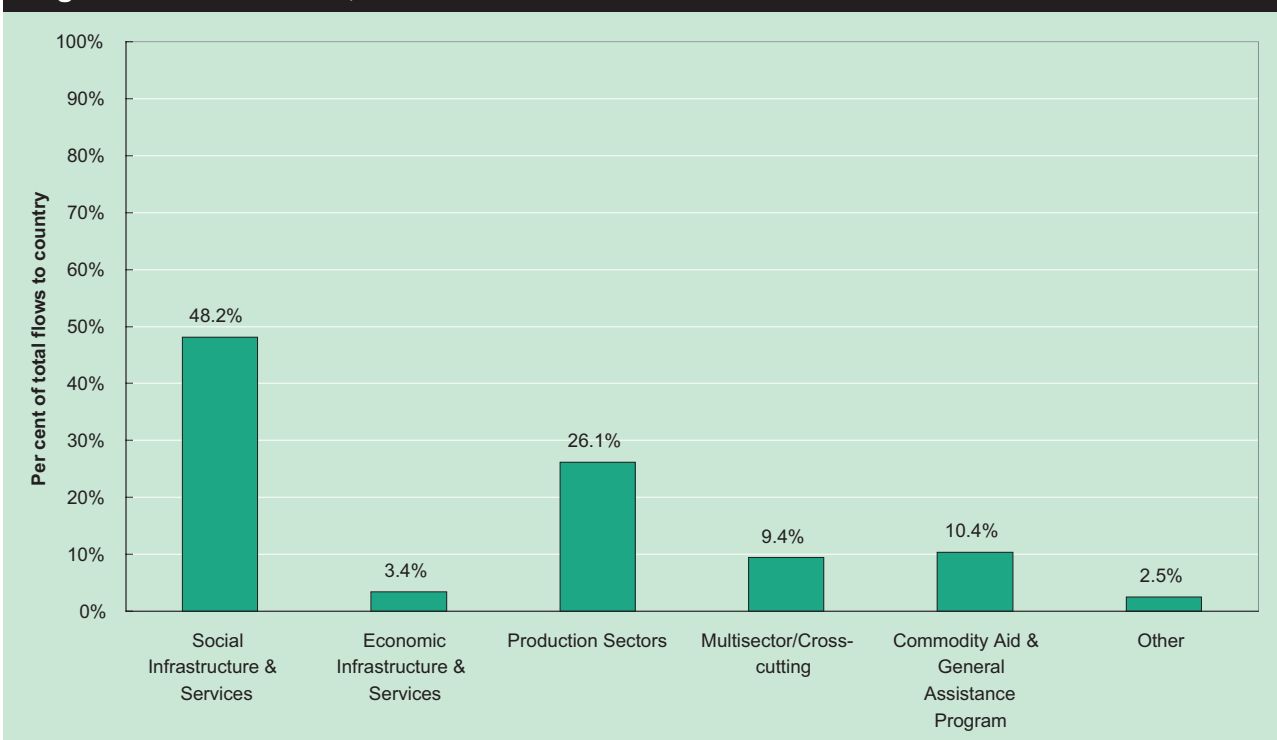
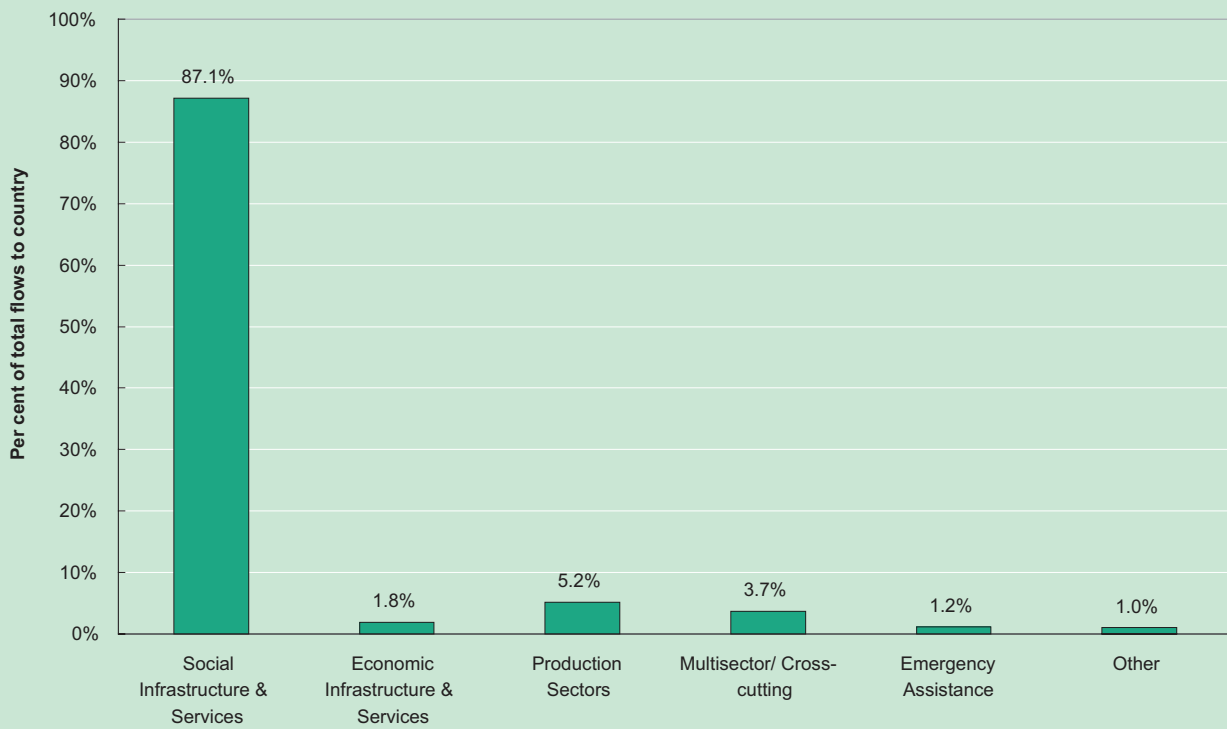


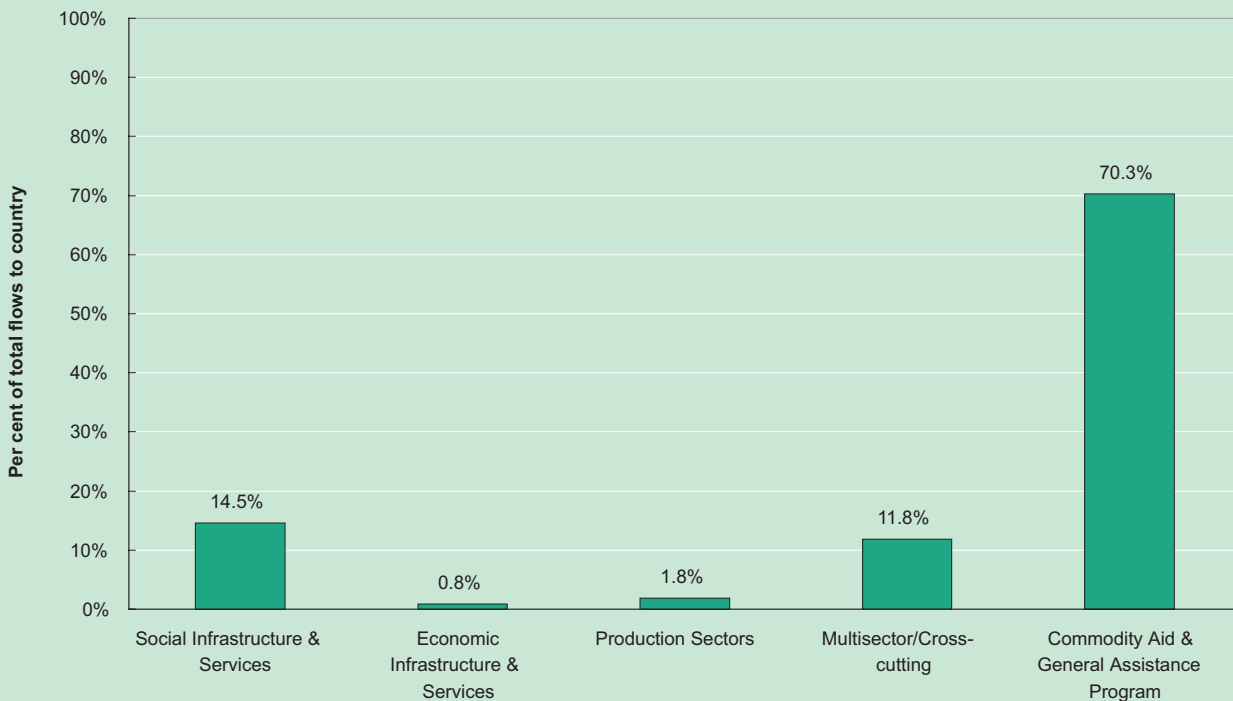
Diagram 6.8: Cambodia, 2002-2003

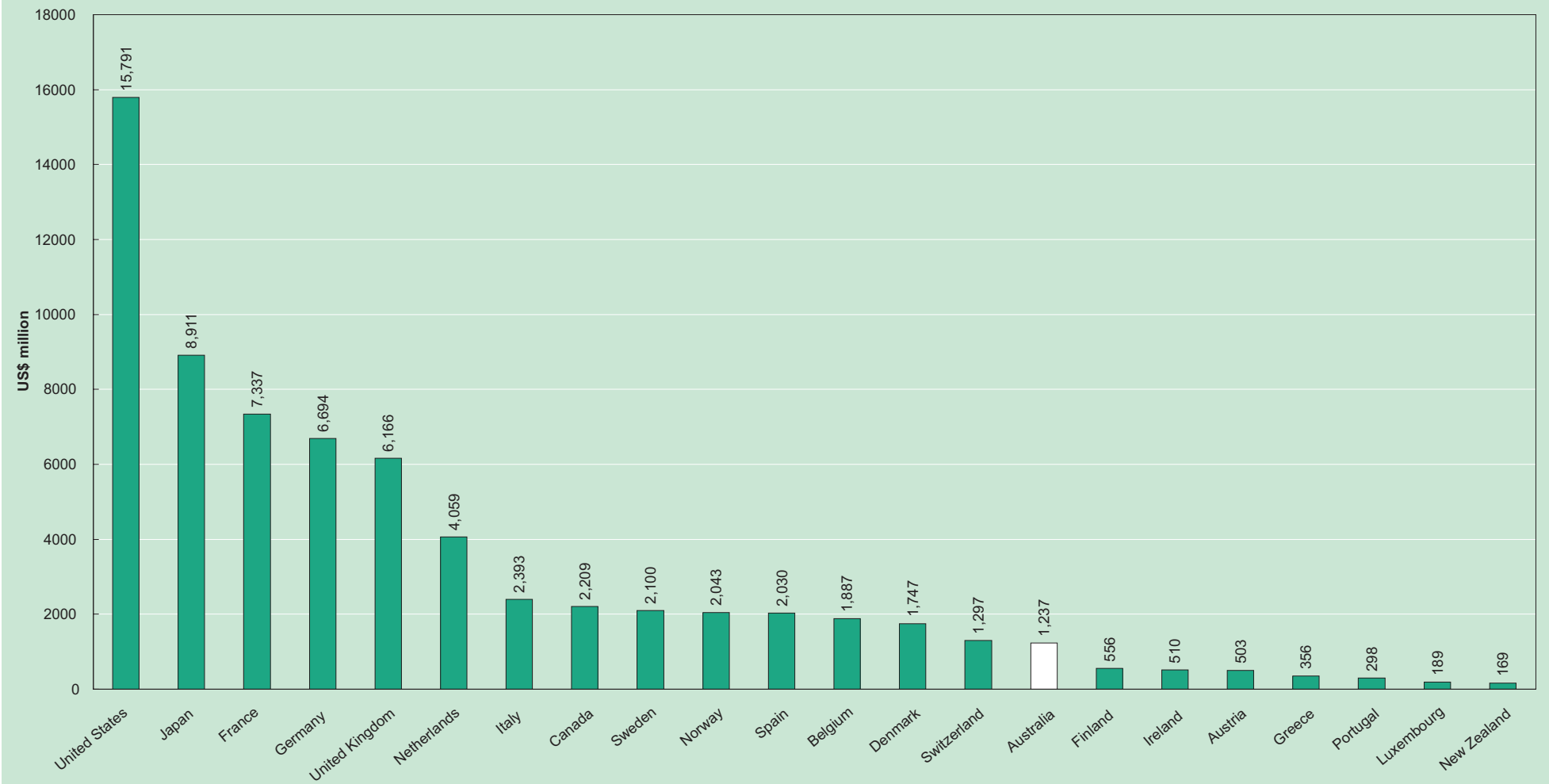

# Appendix 1:

## Glossary

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**Accountable Cash Grants:** for activities involving the acquitable payment of grants directly to partner governments.

**Administrative Costs (including corporate services):** include salaries, equipment costs, rent and other running expenses of AusAID and other official bodies in administering aid programs.

**Development cooperation:** the sum of Official Development Assistance (ODA) and Official Aid (OA). Refer to definitions of ODA and OA and Appendix 2 for more information.

**Co-Financing:** activities involving co-funding with external organisations such as World Bank, ADB, UN etc.

**Commodity Assistance Program (CASP):** provides grants to purchase and import Australian goods for developmental purposes. The scheme operates in African and Pacific Island countries.

**Constant Prices:** prices expressed in terms of the value of a chosen base year. Constant prices eliminate the effect of inflation on a series of figures, making them directly comparable.

**Country Program:** covers forms of aid administered by AusAID in agreement with partner country governments. Forms of aid include bilateral projects, staffing assistance, co-financing, bilateral food aid (except emergency food), Commodities Assistance Program (CASP), training and other support.

**Cross-Regional Program:** aid administered by AusAID for the benefit of one or more regions of the world. The relevant expenditures are allocated to the countries of flow where identifiable.

**Current Prices:** express value in terms of the value in the year of expenditure. (they record expenditure without any adjustment for inflation).

**Development Assistance Committee (DAC)** of the Organisation for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD). The key activities of the DAC are as follows:

- i. adopts authoritative policy guidance for Members;
- ii. conducts periodic critical reviews of its Members' programs;
- iii. provides a forum for dialogue, exchange and the building of international consensus on policy and management issues of interest to Members; and
- iv. publishes statistics and reports on aid and other resource flows to developing countries and countries in transition and related matters, based principally on reporting by DAC Members.

**Direct Aid Program (DAP):** development cooperation funds disbursed at the discretion of the (Australian) Head of Mission for small-scale development activities. This program is a sub-set of the Cross-Regional Program.

**Global Program:** development cooperation administered by AusAID on a worldwide basis, as opposed to country-specific or regional-specific basis. It includes contributions to international organisations, emergency, humanitarian and refugee aid (including emergency food), contributions to Non Government Organisations (NGOs) and volunteer programs, development education and public information, trade-oriented programs, and research programs including the International Seminar Support Scheme (ISSS).

**Gross National Income (GNI):** income that accrues to those persons, enterprises and other organisations that are regarded as residents of a country. GNI equals gross domestic product plus residents' income from overseas property or productive activity less income transferred overseas. Under the new international System of National Accounts (SNA93) adopted by the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS), the actual measure used for comparative purposes is Gross National Income (GNI). This figure is similar, though not identical, to Gross National Product (GNP). Historical GNP figures throughout this publication have been revised to reflect the change to GNI.



**Implicit Price Deflator:** provides an indication of the overall movement in the price of goods and services produced in Australia, whether used for domestic consumption or for exports. It is usually provided as an index figure for each financial year against a base year. Implicit price deflators provided by the ABS are rebased every year.

**Multilateral Flows:** resources channelled via international organisations active in development (eg World Bank, Asian Development Bank, UNDP, UNICEF, WFP).

**Non Government Organisation (NGO):** a voluntary, not-for-profit community organisation, which undertakes international development cooperation and/or development education.

**Official Assistance (OA):** consists of flows that meet all the tests of ODA (see below), except that they are directed to countries on Part II of the DAC List of Aid Recipients (see Appendix 2) and to multilateral institutions which primarily benefit Part II aid recipients.

**Official Development Assistance (ODA):** defined as those flows to countries on Part I of the DAC List of Aid Recipients (see Appendix 2) and to multilateral institutions for flows to Part I aid recipients which are:

- i. provided by official agencies, including state and local governments, or by their executive agencies; and
- ii. each transaction of which:
  - a) is administered with the promotion of the economic development and welfare of developing countries as its main objective; and
  - b) is concessional in character and conveys a grant element of at least 25 per cent (calculated at a rate of discount of 10 per cent).

Some contributions are only partially reportable as ODA. Examples include contributions to the following UN organisations (with ODA eligible component expressed as a percentage):

**Other Official Flows (OOF):** official sector transactions to eligible recipients of the development cooperation which do not meet the ODA/OA criteria, eg:

- i. grants for representational or essentially commercial purposes;
- ii. official bilateral transactions intended to promote development but having a grant element of less than 25 per cent;
- iii. official bilateral transactions, whatever their grant element, that are primarily export-facilitating in purpose. This category includes by definition export credits extended directly to an aid recipient by an official agency or institution ("official direct export credits");
- iv. the net acquisition by governments and central monetary institutions of securities issued by multilateral development banks at market terms;
- v. subsidies (grants) to the private sector to soften its credits to aid recipients; and
- vi. funds in support of private investment.

**Policy and Management Reform (PMR):** the PMR initiative helps Pacific Island governments implement essential economic and public sector management reforms. The focus is on increasing the efficiency and accountability of government, and on helping with the development of appropriate policy frameworks for natural resource management, foreign trade and investment and the domestic private sector. Funds are allocated competitively between countries on the basis of demonstrated commitment to reform and are additional to bilateral programs.

**Projects:** defined sets of activities which have identifiable objectives, outputs, time frames and implementation plans. Projects may be funded on a single year or multi-year time bases.

**PSU (Program Support Unit):** overseas post support unit.

**Regional Programs:** development cooperation administered by AusAID to benefit countries in a specific geographic region. Expenditure is allocated to countries of flow where identifiable.

**Revenue:** refers to revenue from non-budgetary sources, eg payments from ComCare.

**Small Activities Scheme:** activities evaluated and funded that are short term and of small value.

**Technical Cooperation (TC):** the provision of specialist assistance in the form of personnel, training, research and associated costs. TC can be classified as investment-related or free-standing.

**Total aid flows:** total of Official Assistance and Official Development Assistance to all aid eligible countries.

**Total official flows:** this includes ODA, OA and OOF payments made by official agencies (Commonwealth or State) to Part I and Part II Countries.

**Volunteers:** persons who work in a developing country under wholly or partly publicly financed or publicly controlled volunteer programs, receiving a stipend in compensation for their services, ie subsistence allowances, daily support costs, and/or financial remuneration, either during the period of service, or on return home.

# Appendix 3: International Development Cooperation

The data in this publication focuses on detailed information about international development cooperation - the sum of Official Development Assistance (ODA) and Official Assistance (OA). Table 1 of the Development Cooperation Budget Statement, *Australia's International Development Cooperation 2004-05* below shows 'Total Australian ODA' to Australia's major partner countries.

At a macro level (eg total ODA) the data in the two publications match. Due to differences in compilation methods and the classification of some activities there are differences at the detailed level.

For example, in compiling the data for the ABS, where possible, global and regional program expenses are apportioned to partner countries. To ensure consistency when drawing on historical comparisons it was not possible to apportion these expenses in the data for this publication.

Work is being undertaken to ensure that AusAID's new activity information management systems facilitate consistent reporting in the future

# Appendix 4:

## International development cooperation program structure

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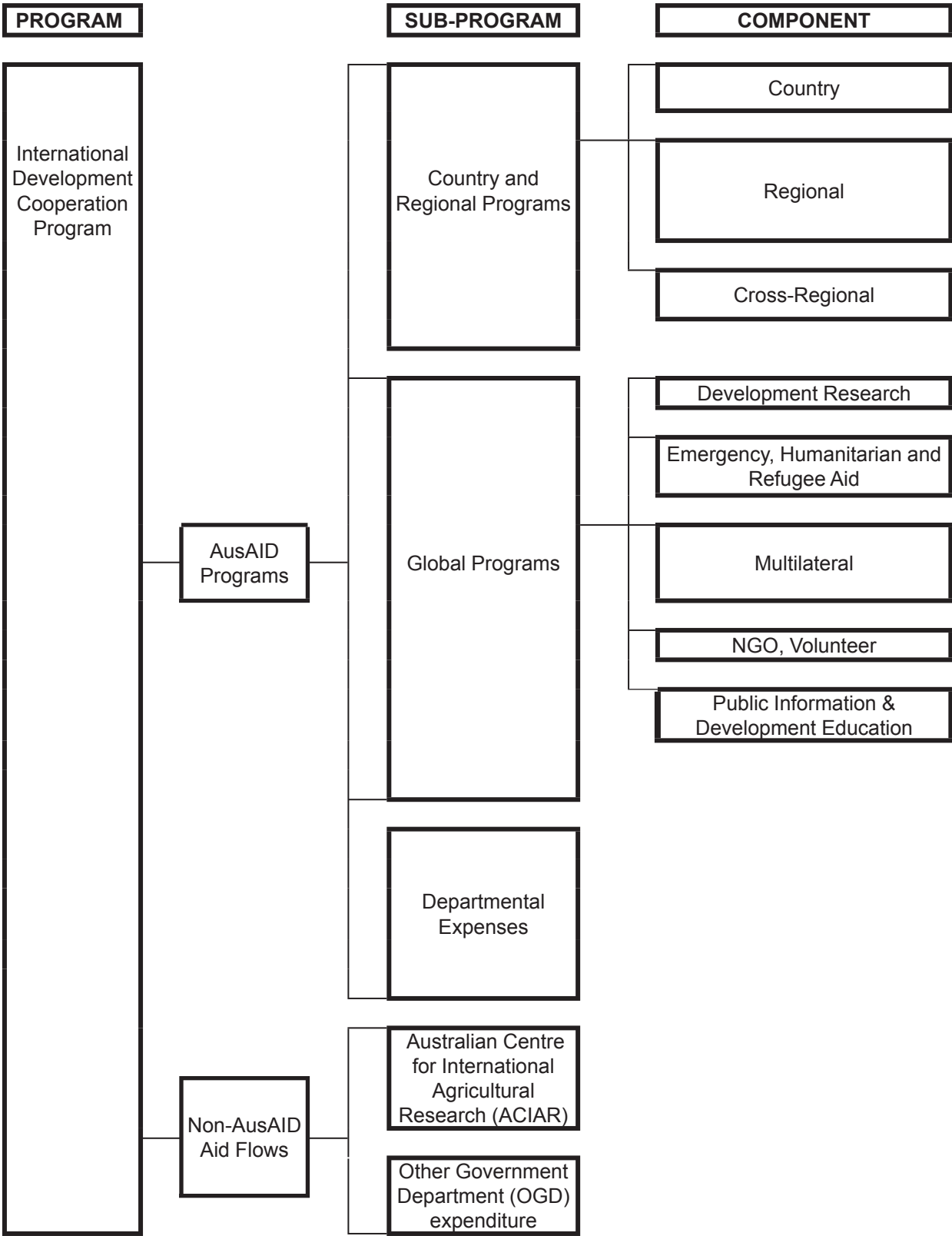
The Australian Government's International Development Cooperation covers all expenditure managed by AusAID and the Australian Centre for International Agricultural Research (ACIAR). The full scope of Australia's total development cooperation includes the AusAID's development cooperation program as well as expenses administered by other Commonwealth, State and local government bodies (Other Government Departments, OGDs).

For the purposes of this publication the international development cooperation program is divided into five main sub-programs: Country and Regional, Global, Departmental expenses, ACIAR, and Other Government Department (OGD) expenses. Most funding is channelled through AusAID's Country and Global sub-programs. Each sub-program is further broken down into a number of components. The individual country programs are agreed annually with each partner country. Global programs may also contain other activities which will benefit the same countries, but which may be part of funding provided to international organisations, such as the World Bank, the Asian Development Bank and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), for their own country programs.

ODA and OA eligible expenditure may also be provided through other Australian Commonwealth and State government departments, and also through local government. For example, Treasury contributions to the International Financial Institutions.

The International Development Cooperation Program budget structure assesses statistics from Australia's perspective as an aid donor rather than from the perspective of the partner country. Neither does it take the perspective of international financial flows, which is the domain of the DAC statistical system. Australia's reporting also differs from the DAC approach, in that figures are expressed in Australian dollars and are reported on an Australian Financial Year (July to June) basis.
