Management Response - June 2017

to the final evaluation of the Integrated Coastal Management Programme (ICMP) in Viet Nam

Summary of Management Response

The program's initial timeframe was 2011-2017 with two phases, phase I (2011-2014) and phase II (2014-2017). In November 2016, it was granted a no-cost extension by Australia until July 2018.

This evaluation mission took place in January 2017, 1.5 years before the end of the phase II. The evaluation found that the program's phase II is very successful with 15 out of 16 points according to the OECD DAC criteria. The early evaluation will enable the programme to properly prioritise the programme activities until the end of July 2018. It was recommended by the mission to continue all needed activities to fulfil the goals set (indicators) for phase II of the programme and to maximise impact where possible. Activities on the ground of phase II will be phased out by the end of 2017 to give sufficient time for the program to collect and share program's lessons learnt with stakeholders Gender sensitive best practice, cases studies and lessons learned will be shared with all stakeholders. A special emphasis will be given to gender sensitive monitoring and reviewing the capacity development strategy of the program.

Recommendations of the evaluation will inform the discussion of a potential phase III of the program.
