DFAT Management Response to the Strategic Review of Australia's Investments in Basic Education in Indonesia (INOVASI, TASS and ID-TEMAN) July 2019

In the final quarter of 2018, a strategic review assessed three of Australia's education investments in Indonesia: Innovation for Indonesia's School Children (INOVASI), Technical Assistance for Education System Strengthening (TASS), as well as the World Bank Trust Fund for Improving Dimensions of Teaching, Education Management and Learning Environment (ID-TEMAN). The main purpose of the review was to inform strategic and management decisions for Australia's future support to the sector. The review focused on the relevance, effectiveness and efficiency of the current investments in the changing context, and identified lessons learnt as well as potential improvements in design, governance and management. It also served as an assessment of the outcomes and impact of the programs to the date of the review. DFAT's response to the recommendations is as follows:
