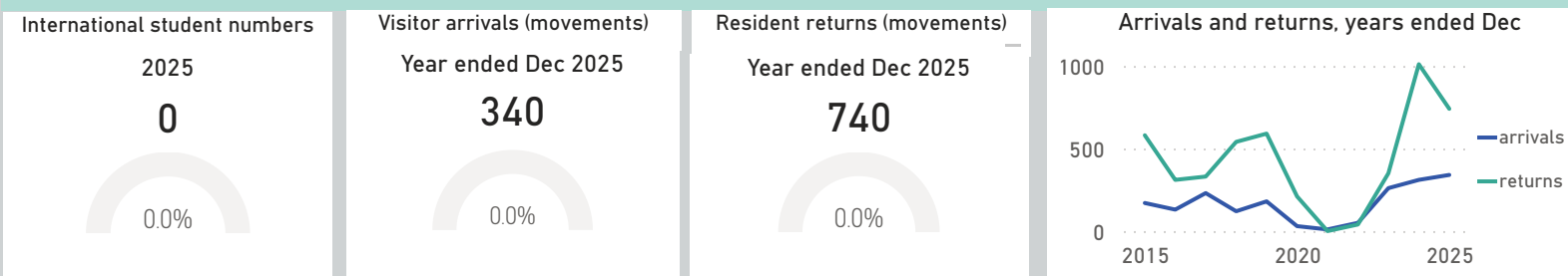
Niue's global merchandise trade relationships, 2025
