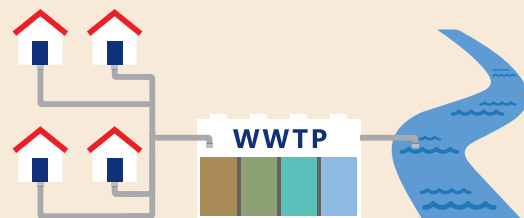


sAIIG

The **Australia-Indonesia Infrastructure Grants for Sanitation** are available to city/district governments to improve sanitation services through the development of existing & new **Domestic Neighborhood Wastewater Treatment Plants (WWTP)**



Each WWTP serves between **150-400 House Connections (HCs)**.

sAIIG Phase I was completed in 2017, **sAIIG Phase II shall be implemented over 3 years 2018 - 2020 and is targeting 23,000 HCs, across participating cities/districts.**



WHAT IS NEW IN PHASE II?

1 Bigger Grants



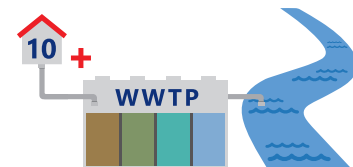
Participating city /district governments are eligible for different grant packages depending on whether they have an existing WWTP in place with idle capacity or no WWTP.

No Existing WWTP



Each new WWTP with **10 functioning HCs** shall receive compensation of **up to 50% of the total number of designed HCs x Rp 13 million***

*maximum value



$$\text{Grant Package 1} = 50\% \times [\sum \text{WWTP designed HCs}] \times \text{Rp 13 million}^*$$



Existing WWTP with idle capacity

Rp 6 million per new HC

connected to existing WWTP



$$\text{Grant Package 2} = \text{Rp 6 million} \times \sum \text{New HCs}$$

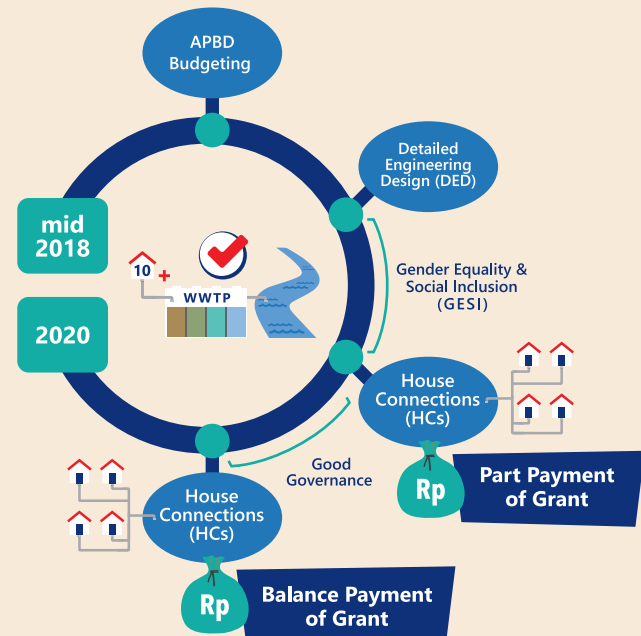
★ For cities/districts that do not own an existing WWTP yet, they may implement both grant packages.

Package 1 (No Existing WWTP)

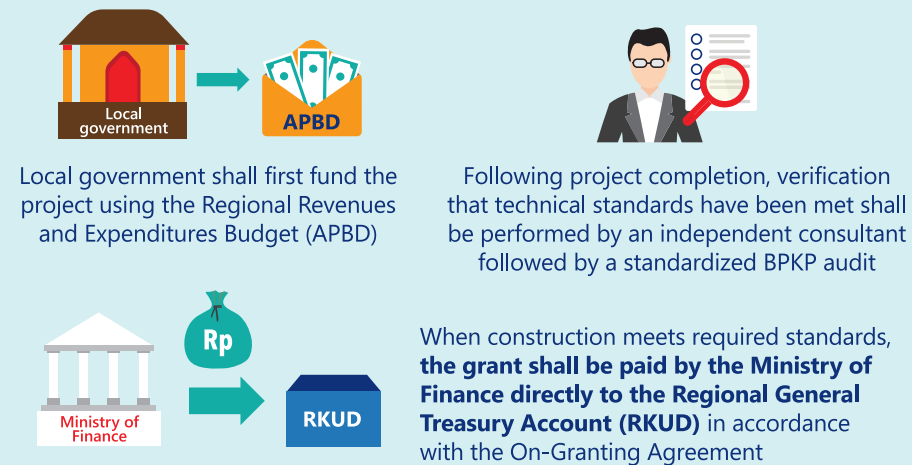


Package 2 (Existing WWTP with Idle Capacity)

CRITERIA AND REQUIREMENTS



Criteria :

A valid **City Sanitation Strategy (SSK) Document**



Residential areas with high population density **(150 people/ha at a minimum)** and



Availability of **land for the treatment facility (for Package 1)**



Requirements:

A letter of intent submitted to the National Government (Directorate General of Human Settlements - Public Works and Housing (DGHS-PUPR) c/o CPMU.



Availability of a **Detailed Engineering Design (DED)** or willingness to **allocate a budget for DED preparation** in the current fiscal year



Willingness to implement **Good Governance and Gender Equality measures.**
