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Forthcoming changes to DFAT's trade statistical publications and products

DFAT will be making a number of changes to the content and range of its statistical products on the DFAT website in 2014. The changes are aimed at disseminating more of Australia's trade statistics as electronic time series data in Microsoft (MS) Excel format (either pivot tables or spreadsheet format) rather than fixed PDF output.

This change will better meet the needs of trade users in the digital age and allows DFAT to release a more comprehensive data set of Australia's trade statistics.

1. Composition of Trade and the Trade in Primary and Manufactured Products publications

The [Composition of Trade](#) (COT) publication will incorporate tables from the *Trade in Primary and Manufactured Products* publication from the 2013 issue onwards. The [Trade in Primary and Manufactured Products](#) publication will be discontinued from the 2012-13 issue.

The new *Composition of Trade* publication will be redesigned to concentrate on the major trends in Australia's trade statistics, looking at both trends in goods and services (on a balance of payments basis) and merchandise trade (on a recorded trade basis), including trade data by DFAT's own trade classification - [Trade Import Export Classification](#) (or TRIEC) and the United Nations' **Standard International Trade Classification** (SITC). The publication will retain the core country and commodity ranking tables.

The detailed country analysis tables (**Sections 6 and 7** in COT) will be removed from the publication to be replaced with the major countries only. Data for all partner countries can be accessed from the DFAT pivot tables. The two pivot tables cover all partner countries (rather than a selection of countries covered in the publications) and publish a longer term time series (rather than just the latest five years).

The new *Composition of Trade* publication will continue to be published on a calendar and financial year basis.

2. Geographic publications – Australia's trade with the Americas, Australia's trade with East Asia and Australia's trade with Europe

The three geographic publications will be discontinued after the release of the 2013 editions in mid-2014. However all the trade data in these publications can be accessed either from the other trade statistical publications released by DFAT, or through the new trade time series data to be released on the DFAT website.

Periodic analysis on Australia's trade with the three regions will continue to be produced and published under the webpage – [Recent trade statistical articles and information papers](#).

3. Enhanced time series data in MS Excel pivot tables and spread sheets

DFAT will expand its range of time series trade data on an MS Excel basis. All trade statistical time series data will be released from a consolidated web page on the DFAT website, under the [Trade and economic statistics](#) page. The time series data will include:

- i) [Trade statistical pivot tables](#). Over the past year DFAT has been trialling two pivot tables on the DFAT website:
 - Australia's exports and imports by all countries and selected country groups by SITC at the 3-digit level; and
 - Australia's exports and imports by all countries and selected country groups by DFAT's TRIEC at the 1-, 2-, 3- and 4-digit levels.

These two pivot tables will now be put into production and released on a calendar and financial year basis.

A new user guide to the pivot tables will be developed to help users who are not yet familiar with using pivot tables.

- ii) Time series data on Australia's trade in goods and services. New time series spreadsheets will be developed covering Australia's trade in goods and services (exports, imports & two-way trade). Data on goods, services and goods and services will be published for 34 of Australia's major trading partners, as well as data by broad geographic groups and selected country groups.
The spreadsheets will be published on a calendar year basis (back to 1987) and a financial year basis (back to 1986-87).
- iii) As part of a new product, *Australia's Trade Through Time* (ATTT), two new spreadsheets will be available in 2014. The first spreadsheet, ***Australia's trade and economic indicators***, contains time series data for a range of trade and economic indicators back to 1901 (and for total merchandise trade back to 1826). The second time series spreadsheet, ***Australia's direction of trade***, will contain time series data for around 60 of Australia's major merchandise trading partners back to 1901 (and in some cases to 1885).

4. Other trade statistical publications

The other DFAT trade statistical publications *Monthly trade data*, *Trade at a Glance*, *The APEC Region Trade and Investment*, *Trade in Services*, *Australia and Australia's Trade by State and Territory* will continue to be published in their existing format. However, in the future it is planned to expand the range of trade data time series to replace some of these publications.

In addition to the regular PDF release of the 2012-13 edition of the **Trade in Primary and Manufactured Products** publication, an expanded range of the tables in **Section 3** (Australia's merchandise trade by principal markets) are also being released in pivot table format, using MS Excel. All users with access to MS Excel 2007 or 2010 will be able to download the pivot table, enabling significantly enhanced analysis of the data.

Compared to tables in the PDF version of the publication, the pivot table includes all countries and commodities. The time series included is from 1989-90 to 2012-13.

The pivot tables provide extra analytical power for statistical research, with functions that include the ability to:

- Instantly switching between export and import views and amongst countries and commodities;
- Pivoting the data to switch your analysis from 'country by commodity' to 'commodity by country'; and
- Sort in descending order to find the top commodity exports/imports with a selected country or the top countries of exports/imports for a selected commodity.

The **Explanatory notes** attached to the pivot table spread sheet describe how to perform these operations.



Australia's trade highlights 2012-13

- Total trade¹ was valued at \$620.8 billion in 2012-13
 - since 2007-08, total trade values have increased by an average of 4.6 per cent per annum.
- Exports were valued at \$301.5 billion (see **Box 1**).
 - export values have risen by an average of 5.2 per cent per annum over the past five years.
- Imports were valued at \$319.4 billion.
 - since 2007-08, import values have increased by an average of 4.1 per cent per annum.

Box 1: Trade overview

In 2012-13, the balance of trade recorded a deficit of \$17.9 billion, a rise of \$14.8 billion on the deficit of \$3.1 billion recorded in 2011-12.

Australia's goods and services exports fell 4.5 per cent to \$301.5 billion in 2012-13. Export volumes grew 6.0 per cent while export prices fell 9.9 per cent. The growth in export volumes was led by *Minerals and fuels* exports. These exports grew by 9.8 per cent in 2012-13. *Minerals* export volumes grew by 10.2 per cent while *Fuels* export volumes grew by 7.6 per cent. *Rural* export volumes also grew 8.7 per cent in 2012-13.

Exports of *Primary products* (which accounted for 61.3 per cent of total exports) fell 6.7 per cent to \$184.9 billion in value terms. The major falls were recorded in *Fuels* (down 11.3 per cent to \$67.0 billion), mainly due to a fall in commodity prices (partly offset by increasing export volumes) and *Minerals* (down 7.2 per cent to \$79.4 billion). Exports of *Unprocessed food* rose 9.9 per cent to \$15.2 billion.

Manufactures exports fell 5.2 per cent to \$39.5 billion (due to a 9.0 per cent fall in *STM* exports) while *Other goods* – mainly *Gold* and *Confidential items of trade*² – decreased 6.2 per cent. Services exports rose 3.7 per cent to \$52.4 billion.

In 2012-13, Australia's goods and services imports rose 0.2 per cent to \$319.4 billion. Imports of *Manufactures* (mostly *ETM* such as *Passenger motor cars* and *Telecom equipment & parts*) fell 0.2 per cent to \$170.9 billion. Import volumes rose 0.3 per cent while import prices fell 0.1 per cent.

The relative price of our exports in terms of our imports is reflected in Australia's terms of trade, which fell by 9.8 per cent in 2012-13.

Box 2: 'Australian produced', re-exports and total exports

Australian produced, or domestic exports, accounted for 96.9 per cent of Australia's total merchandise exports. The difference between Australian produced exports and total merchandise exports is accounted for by re-exports. Re-exports are goods imported into the country and then re-exported without being transformed in any significant way.


Statistics on 'Australian produced' exports include only those goods that were actually produced or transformed in the domestic economy. Virtually all *Primary products* exports are Australian produced (99.8 per cent in 2012-13). Exports of Australian produced *Manufactures* accounted for 81.8 per cent of total *Manufactures* exports in 2012-13.

Within Manufactured products, the ratio of Australian produced exports to total exports has historically been lower for *Elaborately transformed manufactures (ETM)*. In 2012-13, 74.4 per cent of Australian *ETM* exports were Australian produced compared with 98.3 per cent for *Simply transformed manufactures (STM) (excl Nickel)*. For more details refer to **Table 10** in this publication.


AUSTRALIAN PRODUCED MERCHANDISE EXPORTS³

- The value of Australian produced merchandise exports fell 6.5 per cent to \$239.3 billion in 2012-13
 - however, export values have increased by an average of 6.5 per cent per annum over the past five years.
- Australian produced merchandise exports accounted for 96.9 per cent of total merchandise exports (see **Box 2**).



- Exports of *Primary products* decreased 6.7 per cent to \$184.6 billion in 2012-13
 - nevertheless, since 2007-08, exports have increased by an average of 9.9 per cent per annum.
- The decrease in 2012-13 was mainly driven by a fall in the value of *Fuels* and *Minerals* exported
 - down 11.4 per cent and 7.2 per cent respectively on 2011-12.
- Primary products* accounted for 77.2 per cent of Australian produced merchandise exports.

Unprocessed primary products



- Unprocessed primary products* exports fell 9.9 per cent to \$144.9 billion in 2012-13
 - however, *Unprocessed primary products* exports have increased by an average of 12.0 per cent per annum over the past five years.
- Within *Unprocessed primary products* in 2012-13:
 - Food* rose 9.9 per cent to \$15.2 billion
 - Minerals* decreased 7.8 per cent to \$74.0 billion (see **Table A** for further information)
 - Fuels* fell 18.2 per cent to \$48.4 billion
 - Other primary products* decreased 4.5 per cent to \$7.4 billion.


Processed primary products


- In 2012-13, exports of *Processed primary products* increased 7.2 per cent to \$39.7 billion
 - since 2007-08, *Processed primary products* exports have increased by an average of 3.3 per cent per annum.
- Within *Processed primary products* in 2012-13:
 - *Food* rose 2.9 per cent to \$15.7 billion
 - *Minerals* increased 1.6 per cent to \$5.3 billion
 - *Fuels* rose 13.1 per cent to \$18.6 billion (mainly due to increased exports of *Natural gas*)
 - *Other primary products* increased 2.7 per cent to \$115 million.


Simply transformed manufactures (STM) (excl Nickel)

- In 2012-13, *STM (excl Nickel)* exports decreased 9.4 per cent to \$12.1 billion
 - since 2007-08, exports of *STM (excl Nickel)* have fallen by an average of 3.4 per cent per annum.
- Within *STM (excl Nickel)* in 2012-13:
 - *Mineral manufactures & metals* fell 12.2 per cent to \$9.0 billion (see **Table B** for further information)
 - *Chemicals & other semi-manufactures* increased 0.1 per cent to \$3.1 billion.


Elaborately transformed manufactures (ETM)



- *ETM* exports fell 4.9 per cent to \$20.2 billion in 2012-13
 - *ETM* exports have decreased by an average of 3.6 per cent per annum over the past five years.
- Within *ETM* in 2012-13:
 - *Mineral manufactures & metals* rose 0.9 per cent to \$2.0 billion
 - *Chemicals & other semi-manufactures* fell 8.6 per cent to \$4.1 billion
 - *Engineering products* decreased 1.5 per cent to \$11.5 billion.




MERCHANDISE IMPORTS

- The value of merchandise imports fell 1.4 per cent to \$236.7 billion in 2012-13
 - however, import values have increased by an average of 3.2 per cent per annum over the past five years.


Primary products

- Imports of *Primary products* increased 1.9 per cent to \$55.7 billion in 2012-13
 - since 2007-08, imports have increased by an average of 6.4 per cent per annum.
- The increase in 2012-13 was mainly driven by a rise in the value of *Processed food* imports
 - up 5.8 per cent on 2011-12.
- Primary products* accounted for 23.5 per cent of total merchandise imports.


Unprocessed primary products

- In 2012-13, *Unprocessed primary products* imports fell 2.3 per cent to \$25.6 billion
 - however, *Unprocessed primary products* imports have increased by an average of 7.1 per cent per annum over the past five years.
- Within *Unprocessed primary products* in 2012-13:
 - Food* fell 5.6 per cent to \$1.6 billion
 - Minerals* decreased 6.3 per cent to \$958 million
 - Fuels* fell 2.0 per cent to \$22.6 billion
 - Other primary products* increased 8.1 per cent to \$425 million.


Processed primary products

- Imports of *Processed primary products* rose 5.8 per cent to \$30.0 billion in 2012-13
 - since 2007-08, *Processed primary products* imports have increased by an average of 5.8 per cent per annum.
- Within *Processed primary products* in 2012-13:
 - *Food* rose 5.8 per cent to \$10.9 billion
 - *Minerals* decreased 50.0 per cent to \$67 million
 - *Fuels* rose 7.2 per cent to \$18.2 billion
 - *Other primary products* decreased 10.1 per cent to \$875 million.



- Imports of *Manufactured products* fell 0.2 per cent to \$170.9 billion in 2012-13
 - nevertheless, *Manufactured products* imports have increased by an average of 2.5 per cent per annum over the past five years.
- *Manufactured products* accounted for 72.2 per cent of total merchandise imports.


Simply transformed manufactures

 - since 2007-08, imports of *STM* have decreased by an average of 0.4 per cent per annum.
- Within *STM* in 2012-13:
 - *Mineral manufactures & metals* fell 13.6 per cent to \$3.4 billion
 - *Chemicals & other semi-manufactures* decreased 5.8 per cent to \$10.4 billion.


Elaborately transformed manufactures⁴




Australia's Primary and Manufactured products: Major markets and sources









Confidentialisation of ABS merchandise statistics and its impact on partner country aggregates

Introduction

From June month 2013 onwards the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) has been required to apply country level restrictions to a number of commodities to maintain confidentiality within its export data. This has resulted in some commodities being excluded from partner country totals and State/Territory totals. At this stage 53 export commodities⁵ will be excluded, with the major ones being *Cane sugar*, *Nickel Mattes*, *Nickel alloys unworked* and *non-industrial diamonds*. **From this period onwards a number of Country/State totals for exports will be under reported in ABS statistics.** The ABS stated that the change was made to ensure that individual business activity could not be identified⁶.

The 53 confidential export commodity codes excluded from partner country totals may not remain consistent over time. The ABS reviews confidentiality⁰ on a monthly basis and may add or remove some exports codes from this list. For example the ABS added a new commodity, *Fresh or dried macadamia nuts* to the list from October 2013. **Appendix A** shows the full list of the export commodities affected at this stage.

Impact of this change

This change will have an impact on the useability of ABS merchandise trade statistics from June 2013 onwards. It means that users can no longer accurately determine the movements in exports by partner country (and by State) at the total level.

Table A shows that these 53 export commodities in aggregate represented around 3 per cent of total Australian merchandise exports that will not be allocated to a partner country total.

Conclusion

The impact of these changes for the 2012-13 financial year are minimal (only 0.2 per cent of exports or \$602 million), however this issue is going to make it difficult to determine actual trends in Australia's total exports by partner country for future years.

DFAT is working with the ABS towards a solution that better meets the needs of trade users for accurate partner country trade data while maintaining the confidentiality of businesses that report data to the ABS.





Technical appendices

Appendix A Explanatory notes

Introduction

This publication contains statistics concerning Australia's exports and imports of primary and manufactured products based on DFAT's own **Trade Import and Export Classification** (TRIEC). Information for exports is generally provided for both Australian produced and total exports (Australian produced *plus* re-exports).

Merchandise trade data for a number of Australia's major trading partners is also presented using the TRIEC classification.

Trade Import and Export Classification

TRIEC was developed by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade's (DFAT) Trade Analysis and Statistics Section (TSS) to provide information on Australia's merchandise trade by level of processing to meet specific analytical needs of the Department.

TRIEC is a secondary classification created from the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) Australian Harmonized Export Commodity Classification (AHECC) at the 4-digit level (with some 6-digit codes) for exports and the Harmonized Tariff Item Statistical Code (HTISC) at the 4-digit level (with some 6-digit codes) for imports.

TRIEC is fully compatible with the International Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS) and as a result can be used to interrogate partner country merchandise trade statistics.

TRIEC broadly classifies merchandise trade into *Primary products*, *Manufactured products* and *Other goods* (mainly *Non-monetary gold* and *Confidential trade*).

Primary products

Primary products in most cases are used as inputs into other products (with the exception of some refined fuels and processed foods and beverages).

Primary products are further classified as those that have no additional processing (such as mineral ores) and those that undergo some further processing in Australia (i.e. such as beverages, frozen and preserved food products and refined minerals and fuels).

Manufactured products

Manufactured products are further classified as either 'Simply transformed' (*STM*) or 'Elaborately transformed' (*ETM*):

- *STM* consist mainly of basic metal manufactures, chemicals and other intermediate manufactured goods which will be used as inputs into other goods; and
- *ETM* are defined as products with unique features which permit their identification as differentiated products on world markets, i.e. 'finished goods'. *ETM* comprise the bulk of world trade in manufactures.

Although there are inevitably some items for which the distinction between *STM* and *ETM* may seem rather arbitrary, the overall distinction between *STM* and *ETM* provides an important basis for analysing the performance of Australia's manufactured trade.

Data sources

The Australian merchandise trade statistics used to compile this publication are derived by the ABS from information provided to the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service by exporters and importers. ABS editing procedures frequently lead to revisions of previously published trade data and may occur for up to seven months after the reference period. Most of these revisions occur in the first month after the reference period.

In this publication, for the 2012-13 financial year, ABS monthly merchandise trade data as at September 2013 have been used, unless otherwise specified.

For the international merchandise trade data the main source is the United Nations Comtrade database.

Time of recording

The data in this publication are measured on a recorded trade basis, based upon quantities and values of goods measured as they cross the customs frontier. They can differ from data presented under a Balance of Payments (BOP) basis in terms of coverage, valuation and timing.

For further details of the methods used to compile Australian recorded trade statistics, please refer to the ABS publication *International Merchandise Trade, Australia, Concepts, Sources and Methods 2001 (catalogue 5489.0)* which can be found at www.abs.gov.au.

Valuation

Australia data

Exports are valued free on board (f.o.b.) at the Australian port of shipment. This includes the value of the good, the value of outside packaging and related distributive services used up to and including the loading of the good onto a carrier at the customs frontier of the export country.

Imports are valued at *Australian Customs Value*. This is the value of the good as determined by the Australian Customs and Border Protection Service. This is a very close approximation for an f.o.b. valuation of imports.

International data

For China, India, Japan, Malaysia, Republic of Korea, Singapore, Taiwan, Thailand and the United Kingdom exports are valued at f.o.b., while imports are valued at cost, insurance and freight (c.i.f.). A c.i.f. value is equal to the f.o.b. value plus the cost of international freight and insurance.

For New Zealand and the United States the valuation of exports and imports are the same as for Australia.

Australian produced exports

In line with UN recommendations total exports are defined to include *re-exports*, which are 'goods, materials or articles originally imported and then exported in the same condition or after having undergone only minor operations that leave them essentially unchanged'. The remainder of total exports is *Australian produced*. The distinction between the two categories has most relevance in the analysis of *ETM*, where re-exports represent a significant proportion of total exports.

Confidential data

To avoid divulging commercially-sensitive details of individual firms, the ABS restricts release of statistics on certain commodities. Such details are aggregated into a 'dump' item (in TRIEC 3041) in most tables. It is worth noting that commodities are frequently added to the confidential list, e.g. as sugar was in January 1998. In such cases the value shown for trade in aggregates containing these items will show a decrease.

Country import totals for all countries from which Australia imports aircraft will exclude some aircraft from September 2008 onwards. As a result, the values of imports from these countries are understated in aggregate by the following amounts: \$4.8 billion in 2008-09; \$5.7 billion in 2009-10; \$6.0 billion in 2010-11; \$6.7 billion in 2011-12 and \$4.5 billion in 2012-13. Refer to the section on aircraft imports for more details.

Bulk wheat exports by partner country

The value of *Bulk wheat* exports by partner country has been confidential in ABS merchandise trade statistics and was included in confidential item 3041, however the quantity data by partner was published.

From April 2009, the ABS removed this restriction for *Bulk wheat* exports. **Users should be particularly careful in interpreting movements in wheat exports values by partner country between 2009 and 2010** as the reported value of *Wheat* exports will include *Bulk wheat* from April 2009 onwards.

Raw sugar exports by partner country

The value of *Raw sugar* by partner country is only released by the ABS after a six month lag. However, they are not incorporated into ABS merchandise trade data and are only published separately.

The latest data for Australia's *Raw sugar* exports by country is published in DFAT's [Composition of Trade, Australia](#) publication.

Barley exports by partner country

The value of *Barley* exports by partner country is also only released by the ABS after a six month lag. Unlike raw sugar exports, the data is automatically incorporated into the ABS merchandise trade data after this period. In this publication, *Barley* exports for 2012-13 include only exports up to March 2013. Exports of *Barley* for the period April to June 2013 are included in confidential items.

Aircraft imports

The ABS changed the way it confidentialised import data from September 2008 onwards. This change affected particularly the treatment of imports of aircraft in ABS merchandise trade statistics.

Country import totals for all countries from which Australia imports aircraft exclude large and medium sized aircraft from September 2008 onwards. This has the most impact on ABS import data for France (and therefore the EU), which is one of Australia's major suppliers of large and medium size aircraft.

Since June 2010, the ABS has been able to release the actual total country import totals for the United States on a financial and calendar year basis only as a special data service. As a result total imports data are now available from the United States covering all Australian imports from the United States (including both the aircraft and non-aircraft import commodities which have been confidentialised) and have been added to "*Total imports*" and "*Other goods*". This data has also been included into the relevant geographic groups and economic regions (ie the Americas, APEC, NAFTA, North America and the OECD). The ABS is unable to release this data for other partner countries.

Appendix B provides a list of the major TRIEC codes which are affected by confidentiality. For more information the ABS publishes monthly, a list of all AHECC and HTISC commodities with confidential restrictions in place in the publication *International Merchandise Trade: Confidential Commodities List* (ABS catalogue 5372.0.55.0.01) available at the ABS website (www.abs.gov.au). This publication is an essential reference guide for users of ABS merchandise statistics to ensure they are interpreting the trade statistics correctly.

Country

Data for a particular country or group are given on a basis consistent with the composition as at the end of the reference period for this publication (in this issue, June 2013).

Although not members of APEC, Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands are included as they are regarded by the United States as part of its customs zone. When the United States reports its total exports it includes exports from these two self-governing territories. This change was made to make Australian and United States data more consistent.

Country groups are detailed in **Appendix C**.

For exports, 'country' refers to the final destination as reported by exporters. However, exporters may not know the country of final destination of their goods at the time of shipment. This applies particularly to goods directed through entrepôts such as Singapore, Hong Kong and some major European ports, with consequent overstating of Australia's exports to these countries and corresponding understatement of our exports to countries 'downstream' from them.

For imports, 'country' refers to the country of origin of the goods, which is defined as the country of production for Customs purposes.

Series break in Non-monetary gold exports data

Because of a change in the treatment of *Non-monetary gold* imported into Australia for processing and subsequent re-export, there is a series break in the *Non-monetary gold* merchandise trade series between 2009 and 2010. Users need to be careful when interpreting movements between the two years. For more information please email the statssection@dfat.gov.au for the article on '*Gold exports: Impact of ABS revised treatments for goods for processing in ABS merchandise trade*', which appeared as Appendix E in the 2008 edition of *Exports of Primary and Manufactured Products*.

ABS chain volume measures

To enable analysis of the movements of goods and services in 'real' terms, estimates of chain volume measures are presented in Table 1 in this publication.

The ABS chain volume measures are derived by deflating the original current price series by specially compiled measures of price change. The reference year for chain volume measures is the year prior to the latest complete financial year incorporated into the publication. The reference year is updated with the completion of estimates for each financial year.

Prior to the reference year, chain volume measures are not additive, in that the component chain volume measures of an aggregate will not add through to the chain volume measure of the total aggregate. For further information on chain volume measures refer to the ABS publication: *Information paper, Australian National Accounts, Introduction of Chain Volume and Price Indexes* (catalogue 5248.0).

Implicit price deflator (IPD)

The IPDs used in this publication are derived by dividing the current price series by the corresponding chain volume measure.

Terms of trade

The terms of trade shows a country's export prices relative to its import prices. A rise in the index implies an improvement in a country's terms of trade, enabling it to purchase more imports from the same amount of exports. A fall in the index implies deterioration in a country's terms of trade, requiring it to export more to purchase the same amount of imports. Movements in the terms of trade are used in assessing the changing purchasing power of exports over imports, analysing real income, and evaluating the level of consumption that can be sustained in the domestic economy.

The terms of trade are measured using the following index:

Implicit price deflator (IPD) for the export (credit) item divided by the IPD for the import (debit) item, multiplied by 100.

The IPDs are derived by dividing current price series by the corresponding chain volume measure for exports and imports.

Trend growth rates

Trend rates of growth have been derived by log-linear regression using the least squares method. It is a more robust measure than the 'average' annual growth rate as it takes account of all observations and is so less likely to be affected by the end points of a given period.

Total trade

Total trade is the sum of exports and imports. This is a useful measurement of the overall trading relationship between Australia and its trading partners. Total trade data is useful in ranking Australia's major trading partners, without a bias towards ranking only the larger export markets, or the larger import sources.

Balance of trade

The balance of trade is the difference between exports and imports. When exports exceed imports this is referred to as a trade surplus, when imports exceed exports this is referred to as a trade deficit.
